Elementary students are taught a memory device to assure the correct spelling of the word **principal**: A **principal** is your **pal**. Over the past 29 years, thousands of high school students have voluntarily, or involuntarily, had the privilege of talking with a true **FRIEND**, WDHS Principal Frederick Reineking.

During his 37 years of service to the Dells school system, Mr. Reineking's patience, tolerance, empathy, understanding and good sense of humor have earned him outstanding respect from approximately 3,500 graduates, over 200 faculty members, and innumerable community members. Coming to the Dells in the fall of 1946, Mr. Reineking joined a staff of eleven high school teachers, seven of whom were in their first year of employment. That was a year of beginnings for Mr. Reineking and 210 high school students, not to mention the starting of an official bus transportation system in the Dells.

His teaching assignments included Social Problems, U.S. History, and Latin. He also served as assistant coach for football, basketball and

track until the spring of 1951. During the fall semester of that year, he fulfilled the duties of the first high school assistant principal, a position he held until becoming the full-time principal of the newly constructed WDHS in 1954. Mr. Reineking takes special pride in this building since he helped supervise its original construction and four additions and has been the only principal to have administered the building.

Mr. Reineking graduated from Lakeland College, Plymouth, WI, and received his Masters Degree in School Administration from UW-Madison. His "on-the-job" training as professional educator and administrator came from three inspiring superintendents, Paul Loofboro, R.W. Fenske, and Gerald Peterson. Their positive influence have had a great impact upon Mr. Reineking's professional outlook. Very early he acquired the motto when dealing with students to be "FIRM, FRIENDLY & FAIR." Down through the years he has learned to treat every student with the same respect. "An educator has to be a genuine, honest person; stu-

dents can see right through a fake." Mr. Reineking is saddened at the thought of students who are "bound and determined not to succeed regardless of extended help from the staff and administration." On the other hand, he takes pride in the accomplishments of graduates, hoping that their experiences at WDHS have played a role in their successes.

Mr. Reineking has treasured his principalship and "would be privileged to do it over again in Wisconsin Dells . . . a great community, with a great bunch of kids." In retirement, as throughout his educational career, he has set goals to achieve. "Goals get people going and keep them from getting in a rut or becoming stagnant." Enjoying ones family has always been foremost with Mr. Reineking. During his 38 years of marriage to Wilma and watching their two daughters grow, graduate from WDHS, and find happiness in marriage and careers, Mr. Reineking has filled many versatile footsteps — teacher, administrator, husband, father, and **FRIEND**.

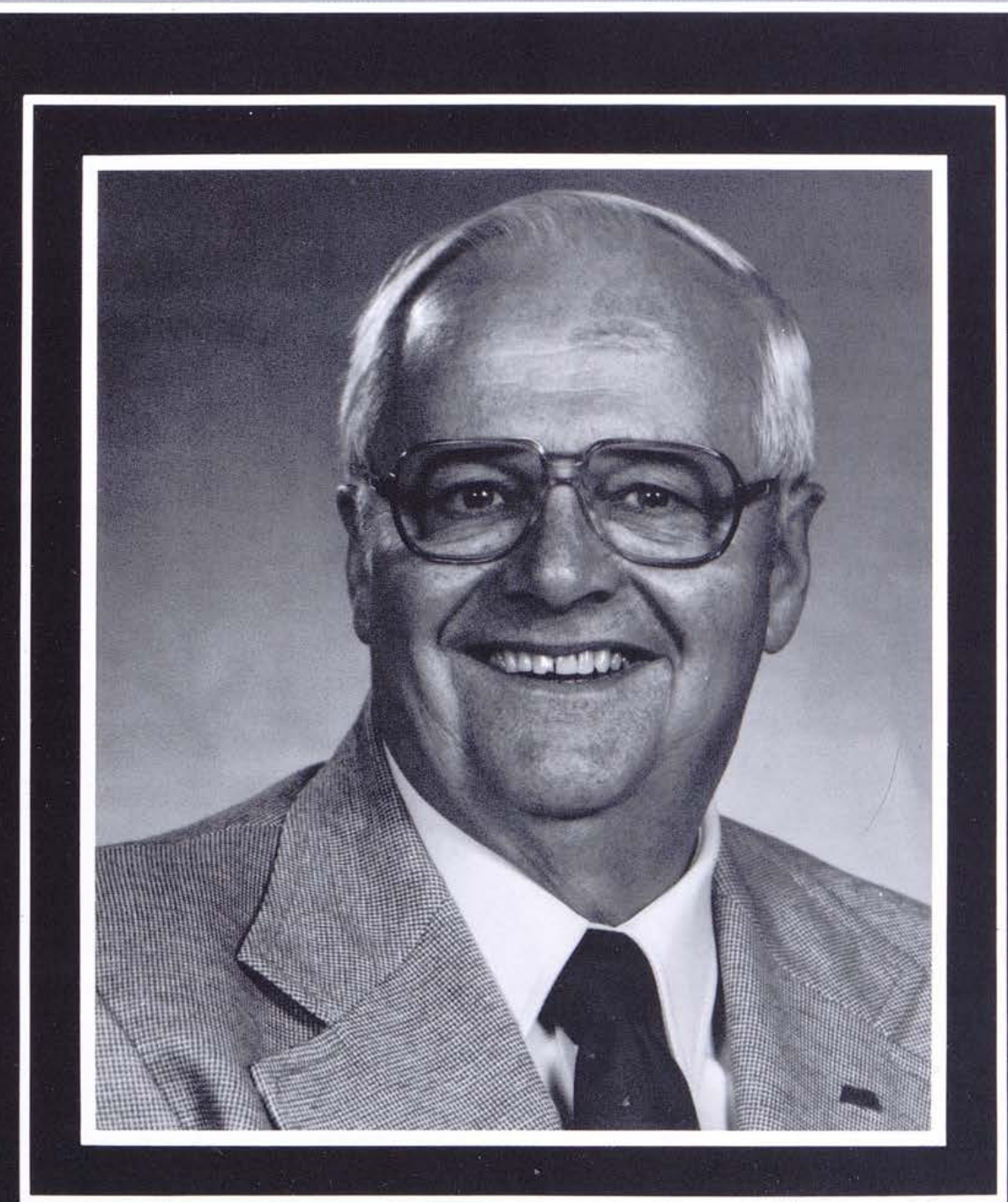


1/ V.I.P.'s rank at the school. 2/Mr. Reineking's first year as principal.

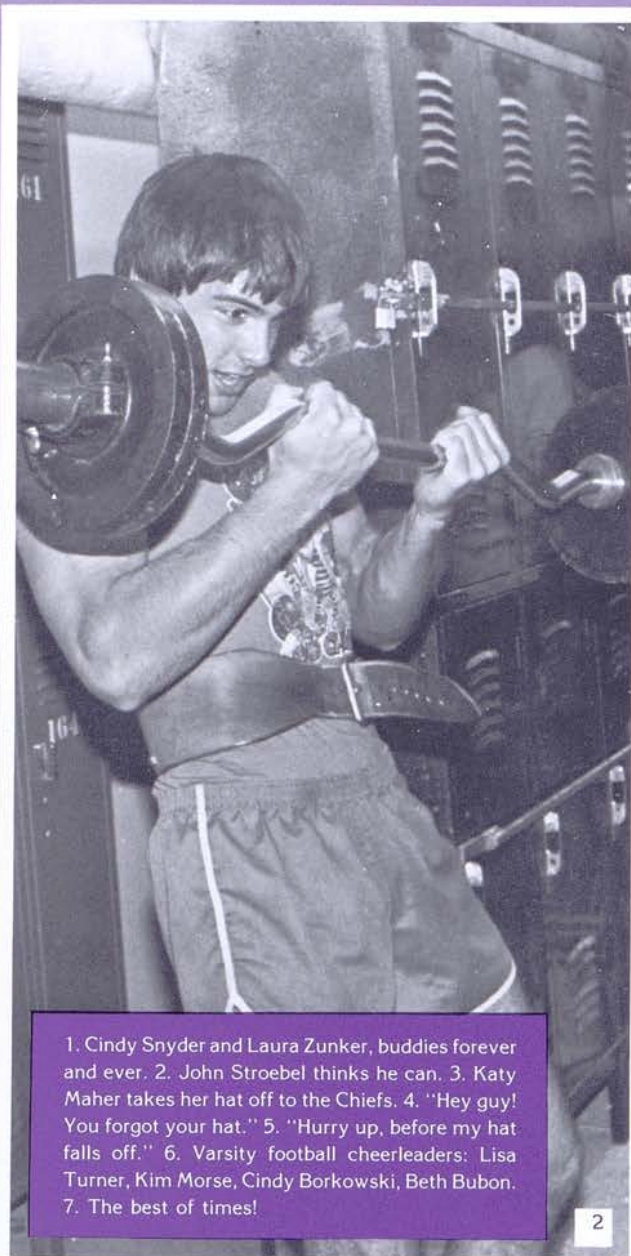

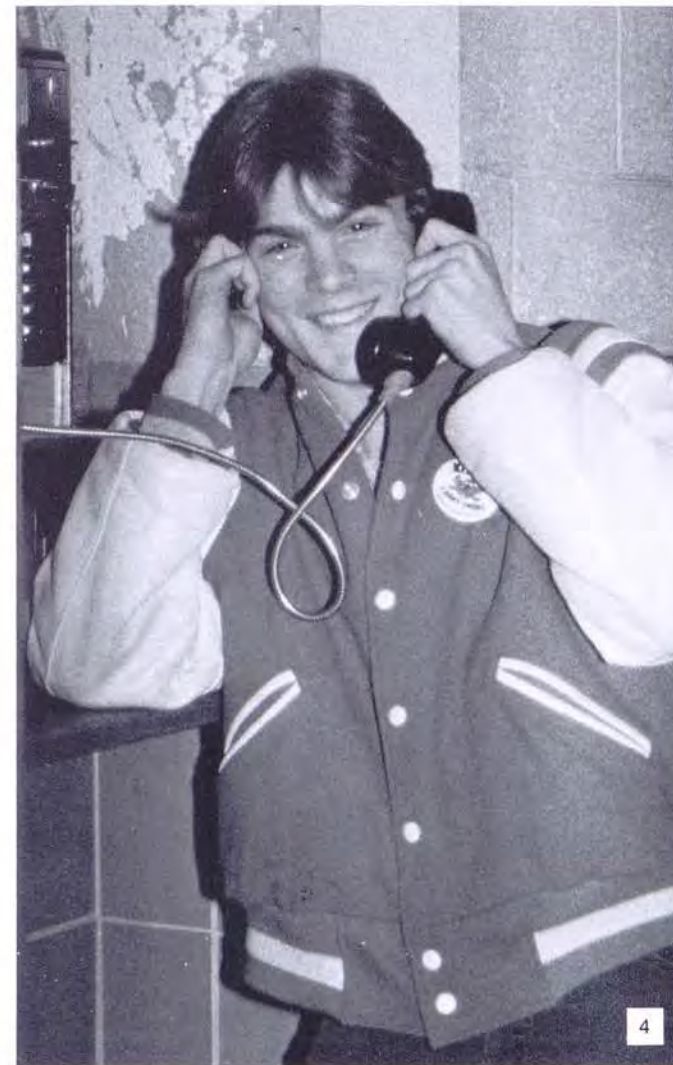

Park benches, porch swings and an elegant gazebo helped to convey the 1982 Prom theme, "An Evening in the Park."

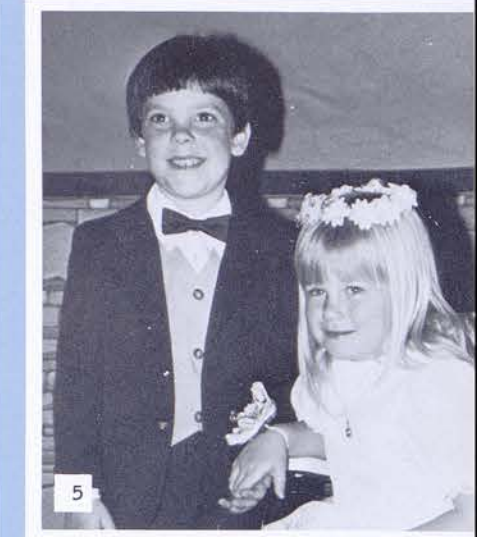
Preparations for Prom began in early October when the Class of '83,

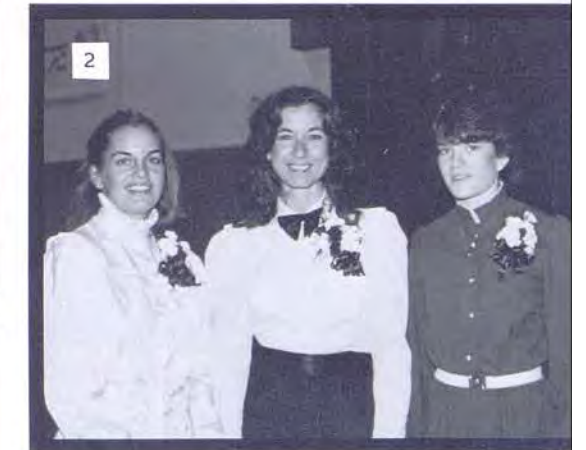
Once Upon a Musical

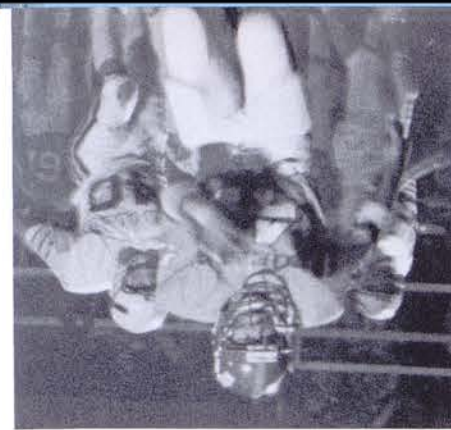

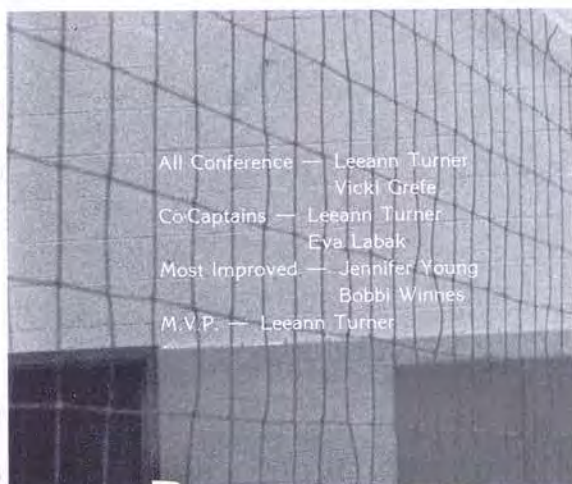

Chiefs Hit Disappointing Season

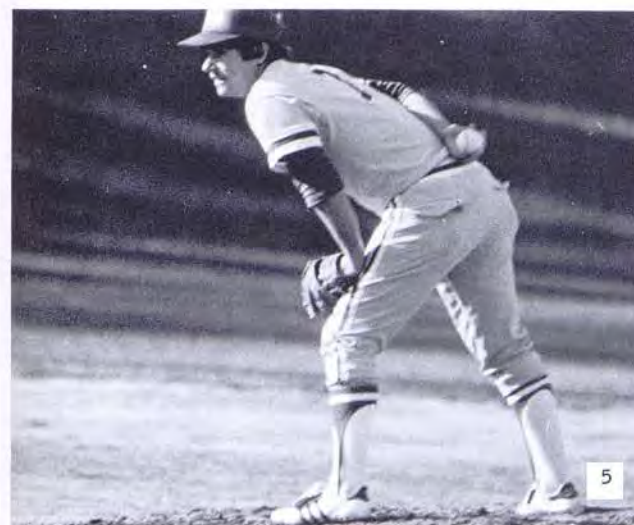

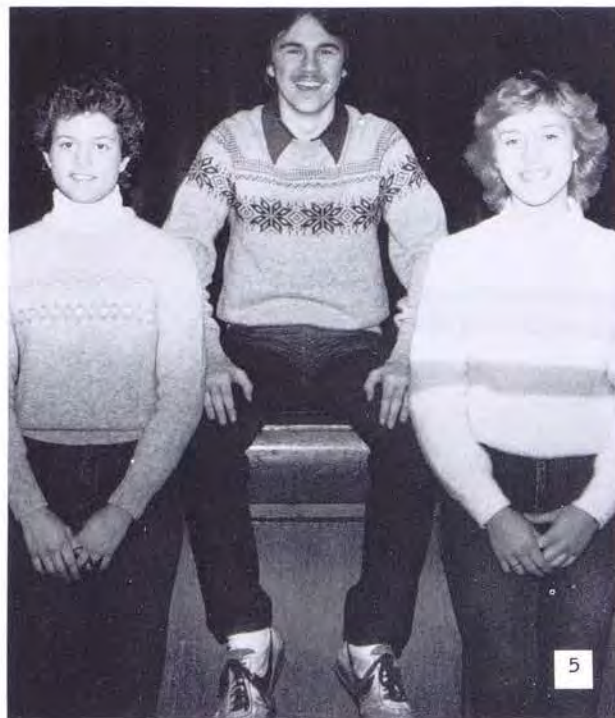
