Don Nichols summed up the emotions of the evening by stating, "Prom was a memorable experience that I'll never forget."





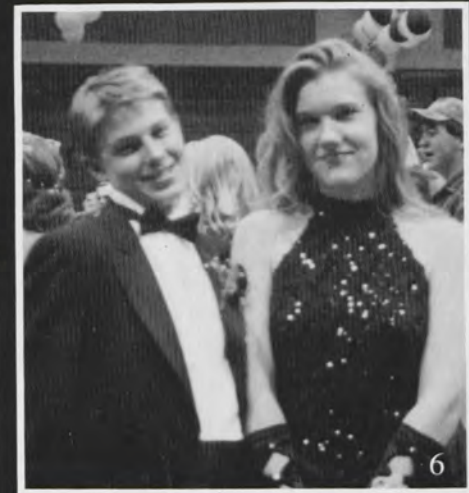
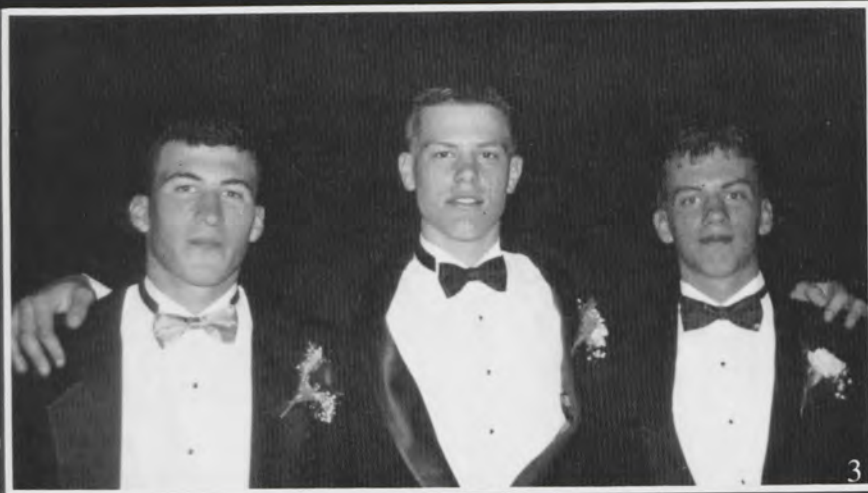

Captain Jori White said,

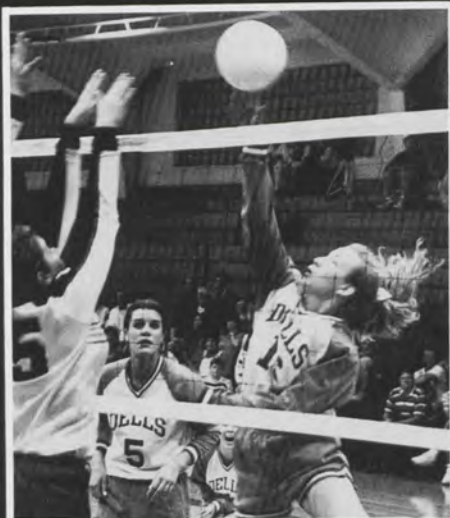
"I was really impressed with the fan turnout...I am glad more people are realizing what a great sport volleyball is."

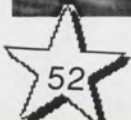
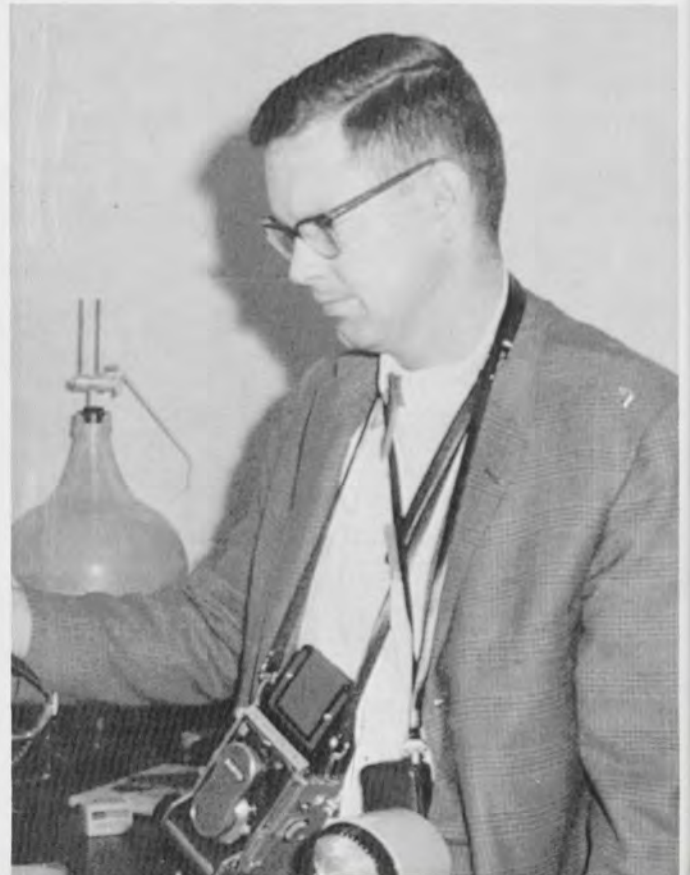
After 36 years of dedicated teaching, Richard Schauf decided to retire as an educator of math, chemistry and computer science.

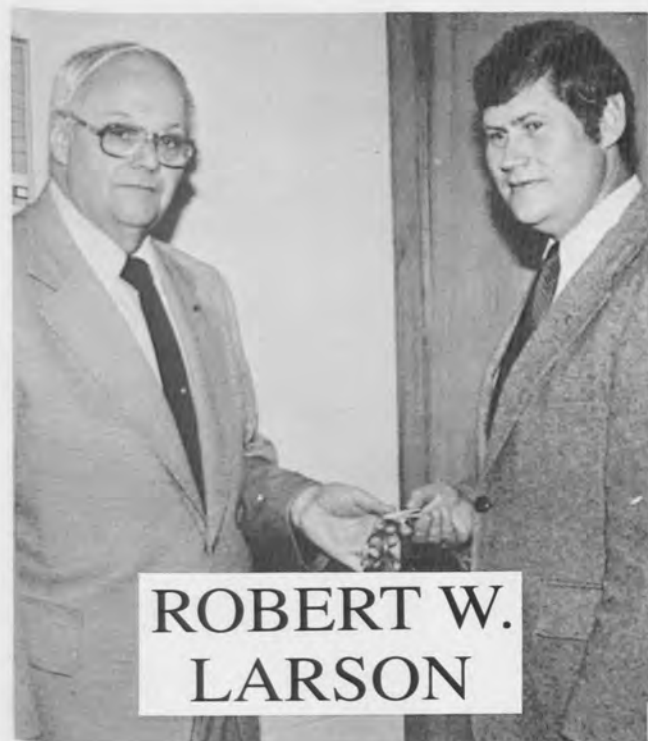
Schauf graduated from Platteville with a major in chemistry, a minor in math and a minor in physical education. Schauf began his career at Wisconsin Dells High School in 1960. He has been chairman of the science department since 1962, and figuring an average teaching load of 100 students a year, he thinks he has probably taught about 3,600 kids, including nine of his own.

Schauf said, "I have no regrets. I really like working with kids." His goal in the classroom has always been: "Trying to teach them to think. I've always had good kids, and I have tried to give the kids the best education possible." The most rewarding and significant aspect of his job was: "When a former student returns to say 'thank you for what you've done,'" he said.

Along with his high school teaching duties, Schauf has taught many MATC adult education classes and college computer courses. He was the starter for all home track meets from 1962 to 1992, refereed football and basketball games, coached boys volleyball for 15 years bringing home a conference championship and was assistant football coach for two years.

Schauf had titles over the years ranging from teacher of the year in 1985 to Mayor of the Dells for two terms. Now as he retires, WDHS would like to say "Thank you Mr. Schauf for all of the times you would drop what you were doing to help fix computers, cameras and copy machines."





PRIDE... the quality of state of being proud, a reasonable or justifiable self respect. As a noun often used by former Principal Robert Larson, "pride" was never associated with the meanings of conceit or vanity. Beginning each school year, Larson would appeal to the inner pride of Dells students and staff in his opening remarks at the all-school assembly.

Larson served the high school as the assistant principal and athletic director for ten years until 1983, at which time the school board recognized his potential as an administrator, educator, and motivator and hired him as principal after Fred Reineking's retirement. Over his ten years as principal, Larson teamed with assistant principals Bill Breen, Larry Black and Sandra Murray to promote pride in various disciplines, including excellence in academics, sports and extracurricular activities.

"The most rewarding part of being an administrator is to see students grow in intellect, maturity, and experience success while in high school and after graduation," Larson remarked. "Through their competitive spirit and commitment, the pride that Wisconsin Dells students had for our high school was always very obvious to me," he stated.

Because of Larson's personal and educational philosophy, one which encourages self worth, dignity, and respect, he initiated many programs and new endeavors at WDHS. Advanced placement classes were offered, the high school progressed in the computer age, several girl sports programs were developed, the SAP (Student Assistance Program) and POPS (Power of Positive Students) programs were instituted, academic letters were given out, and extracurricular activities, including basketball and Academic Decathlon, excelled.

Larson himself had many educational accomplishments and recognitions during his principalship. The pinnacle came when he was awarded Principal of the Year for Region 5 in 1991.

Now after twenty years in administration, Larson has retired from WDHS. The educator in Larson will continue to promote pride in whatever ventures he pursues, yet the memories of WDHS will always be with him.

"I regret that this past year I didn't have the opportunity to spend more time with students and the faculty. I will miss the smiles of accomplishments, the tears at graduation, and the opportunity to give a handshake to students and faculty and say, 'Congratulations on a job well done.'"

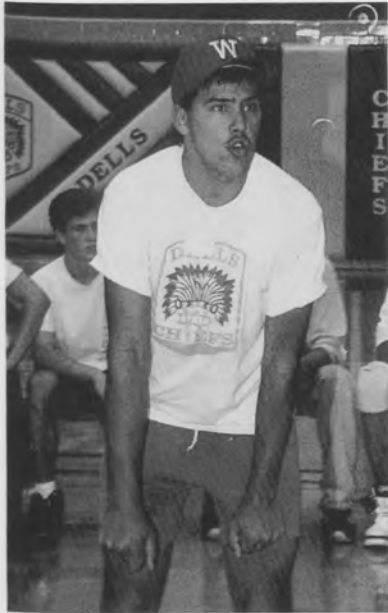

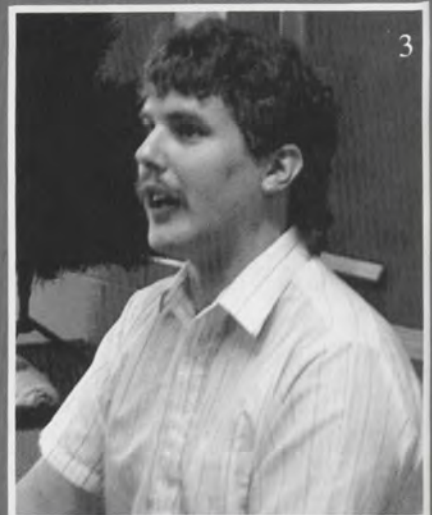


CHAMBER CHOIR

The loss of the man known as, *Heescher, K.C. Man, Mr. Baseball*, and most respectfully Mr. Heesch has been very trying on many of us.

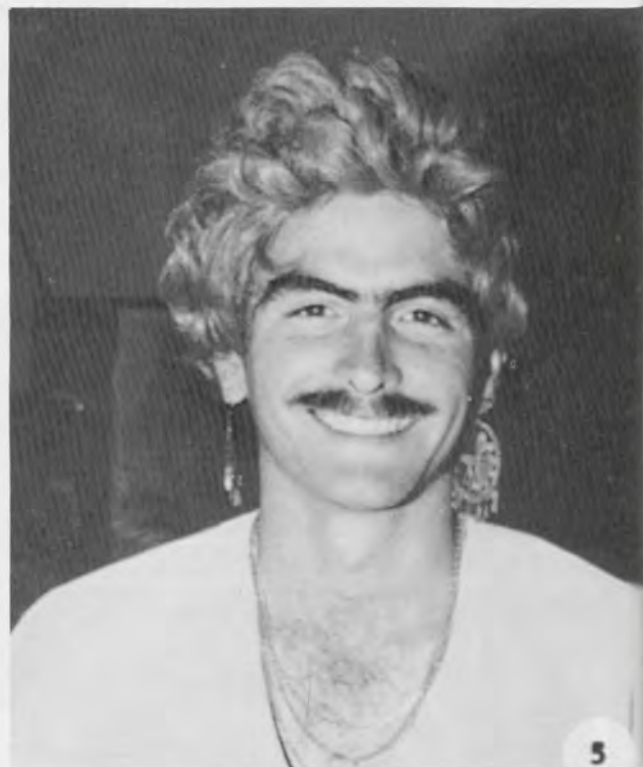
