The Wisconsin Dells Varsity Softball team prevailed this season as South Central Conference Champions, taking the title for the second time in three years.

The Chiefs performed excellent in their Regional competitions by defeating Markesan 2-0, Mauston 17-6, and Nekoosa 7-5. Dale Gray heads the coaching staff with Phil Wenzel guiding the junior varsity and Bill Tofson working with the freshman.

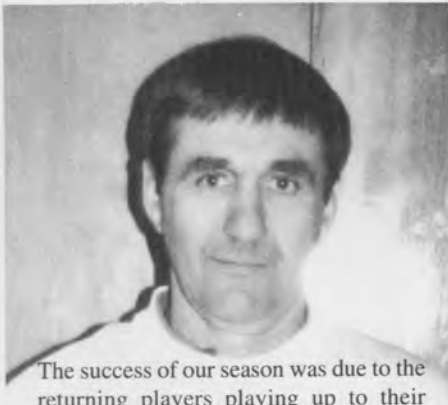
With only three returning letterwinners and a handful of underclassman, Sectionals would have seemed farfetched at the start of the year. The Chiefs had hoped for a third place finish in Conference but succeeded in proving what they could really do by stealing the title right from Conference rival Portage's hand.

Ginny Gray, a three year starter on varsity, said, "Portage was our toughest competition. They have consistently been the team to beat."

Gray was named MVP for the season and was also on the All-Conference squad for the second year. Carrie Ragan received the highest batting average award and was also on the All-Conference squad. Amy Gavinski was given the Coach's award and was the final Chief named to the All-Conference team.

With five players being named to the two Conference teams, an 11-1 South Central Conference Record, and a 15-5 overall record our Wisconsin Dells Softball Chiefs can really be classified as A Step Above the Best.

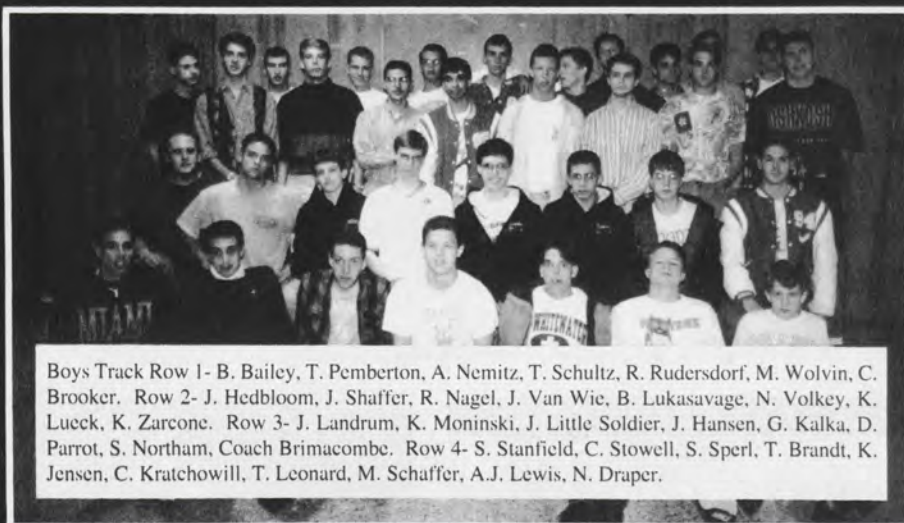

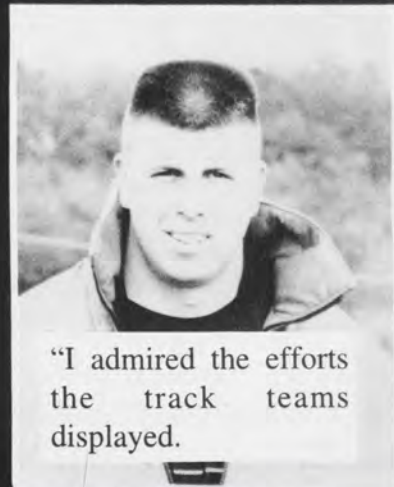

The Wisconsin Dells '94 track team, under the supervision of first year Head Coach Craig Brimacombe, raced off to a fresh start. Assistant coaches Tanya Zapuchlak and Dave Jisa did a fine job specializing with long distance and shot put.

The girl's team started their season off a little slow, but soon showed their competitiveness. The Chiefs were led by Laura Parfieovich in triple jump, Anne Breen and Brenda Nickel in distance, and Jori White in high jump.

Anchoring the boy's track team were Kevin Jensen and Scott Stansfield, both of whom won All-Conference honors. Coach Brimacombe put together a winning 3200 meter relay team consisting of seniors Kevin Jensen, Scott Stansfield, Chris Stowell and sophomore A.J. Lewis. They went on to place at State with a time of 8:20.5, a new school record.

Coach Brimacombe said he expects a competitive and rewarding 1995 season, especially with the talents of the seniors, many returning letterwinners, and a strong group of freshmen. Next year's team will be "A step above the best."

The volleyball program was introduced to three new coaches this year. The freshman were introduced to Coach Meg Perron, the junior varsity was taken over by Coach Sarah Connor, and finally the varsity had the final addition with Coach Genevieve Raddatz taking over.

The season started off with the Chiefs defeating Baraboo. It was important for the Dells to come on strong from the start. Reedsburg, Portage, and Wisconsin Dells were all vying for the Conference Title. Reedsburg and Portage were back to back competitions. The Chiefs suffered losses to both teams. Math minded Kleifgen retires

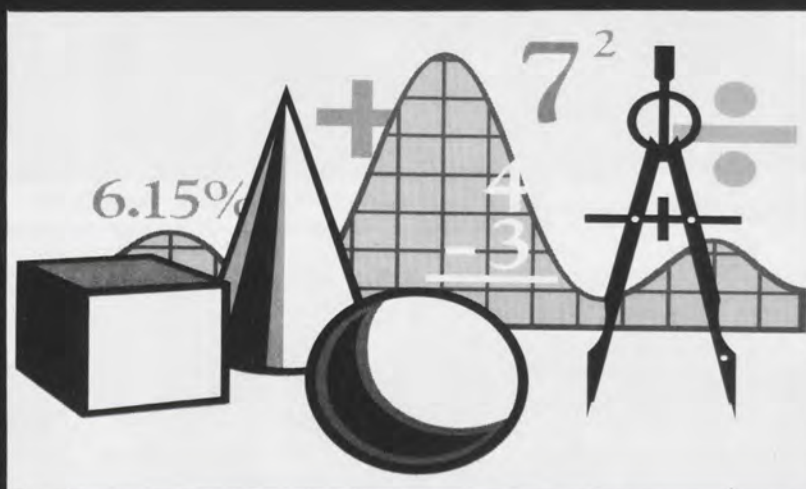

It all adds up to retirement: Kleifgen plans to spend many enjoyable, relaxing hours at her cabin up north.

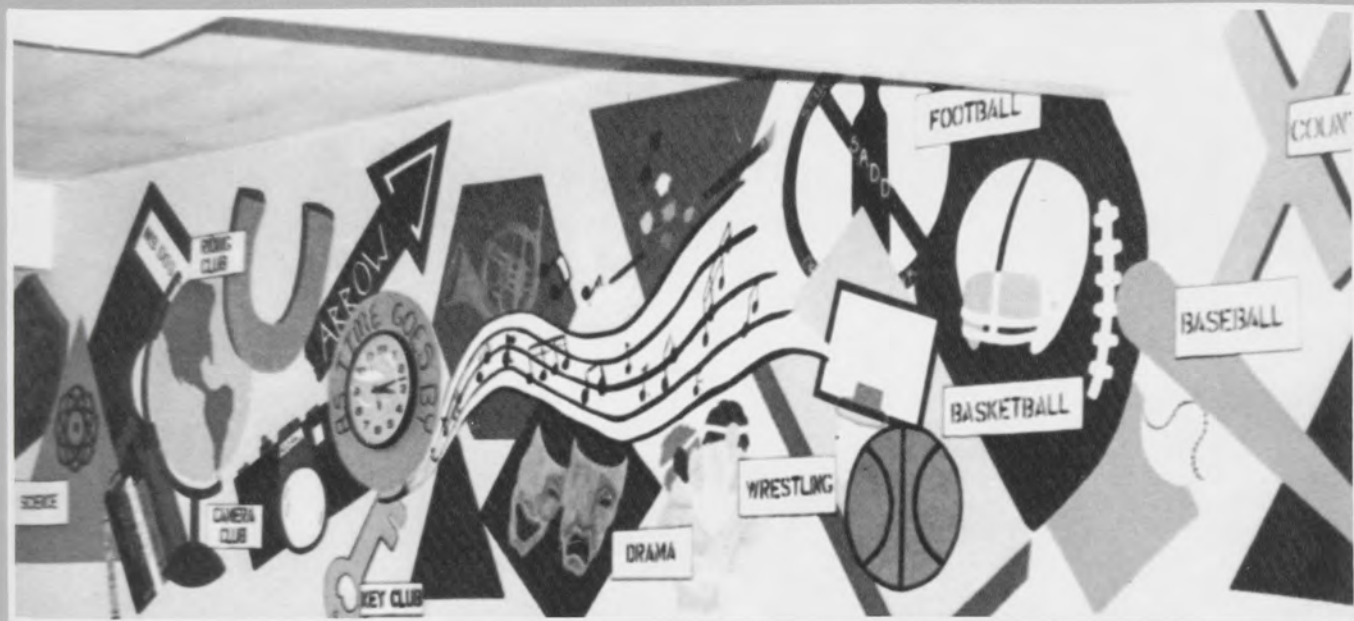

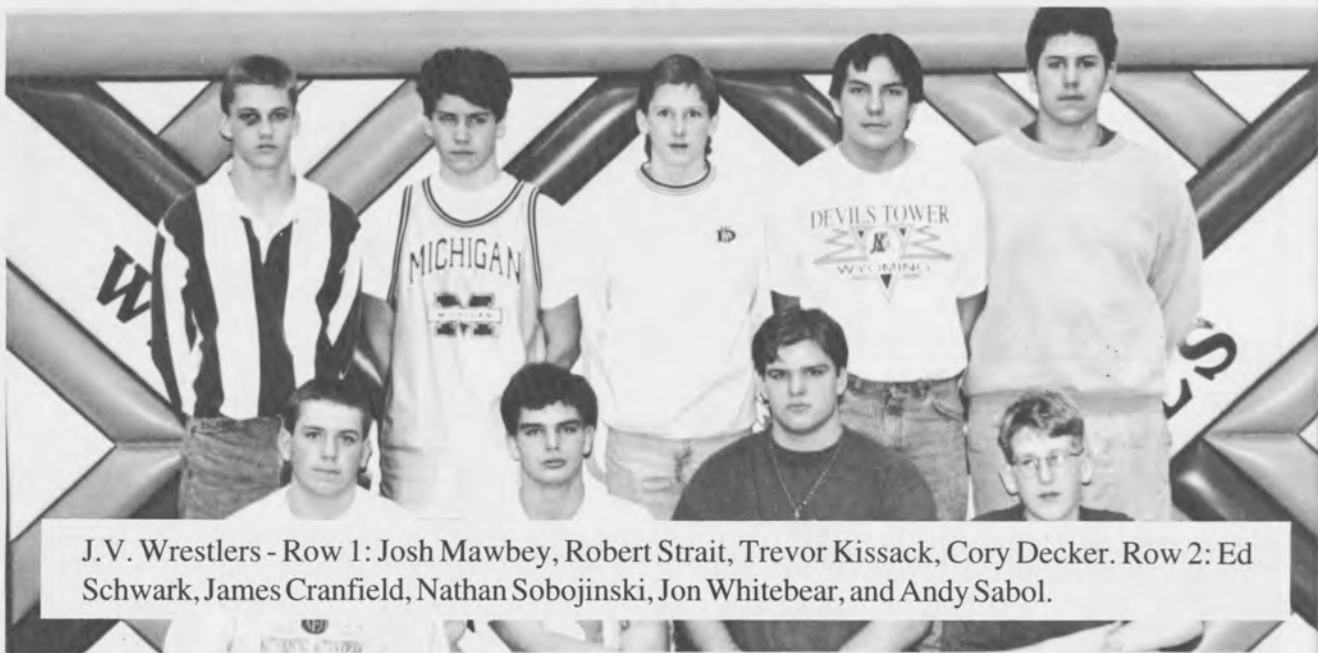

Through the years, classes enter WDHS and classes graduate from WDHS. We, the class of 1995, made this year: A Step Above the Rest.



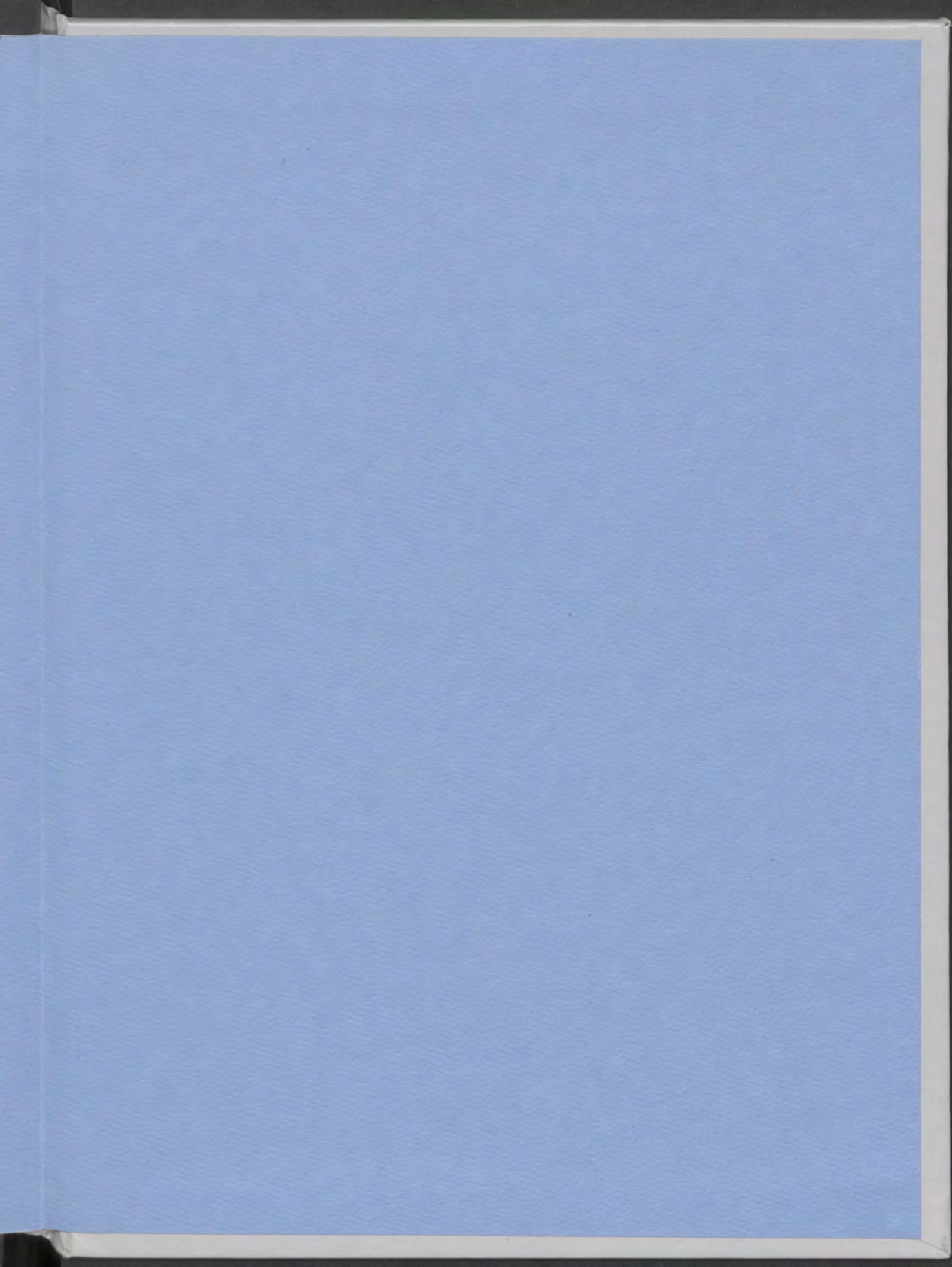
