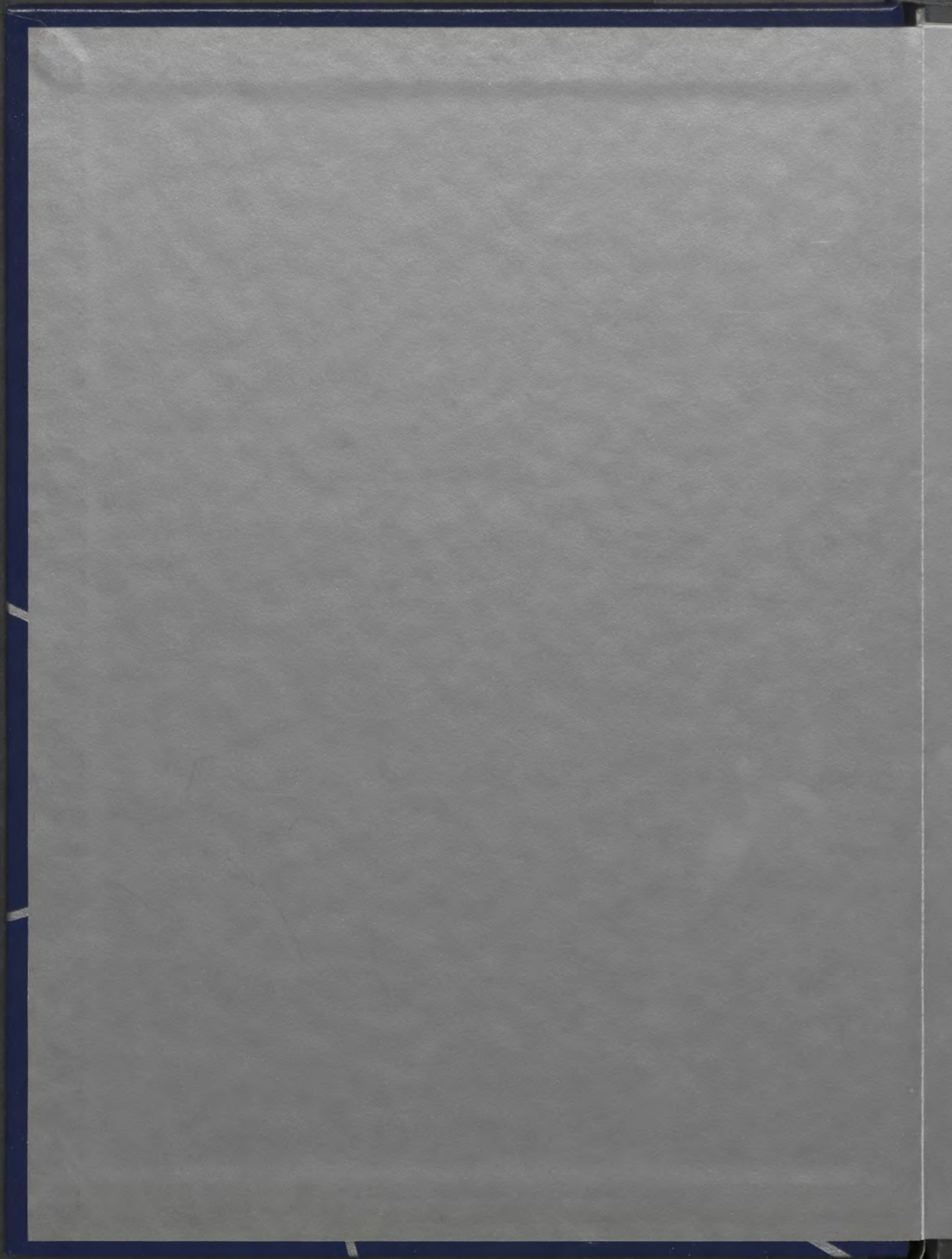



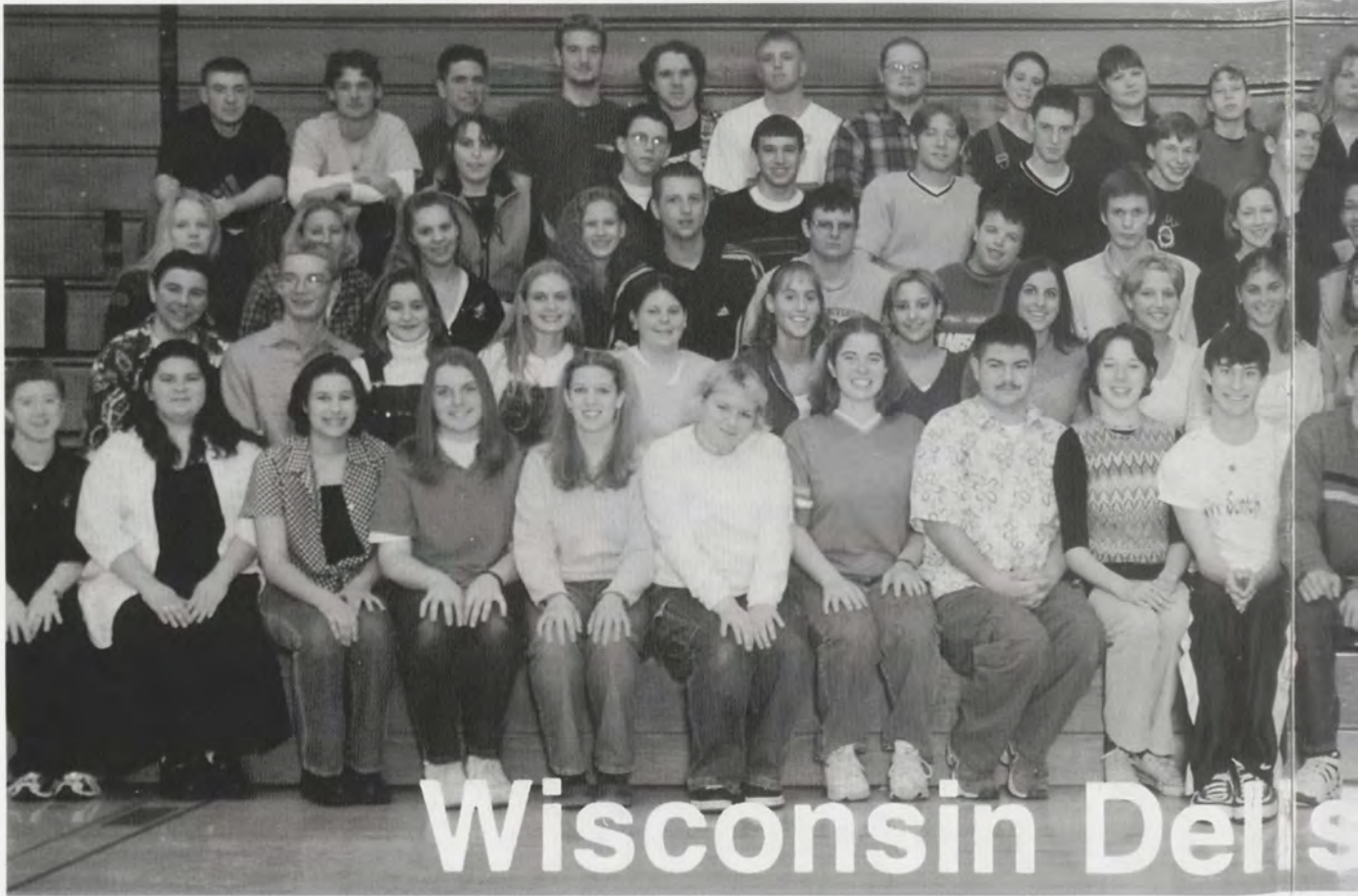


A Whole New Direction

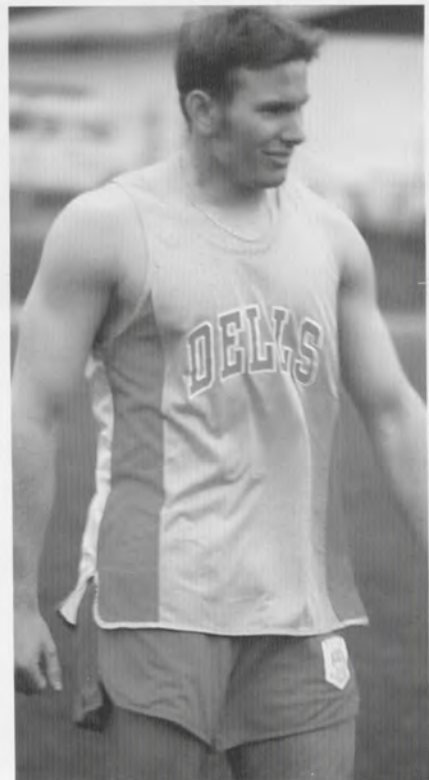

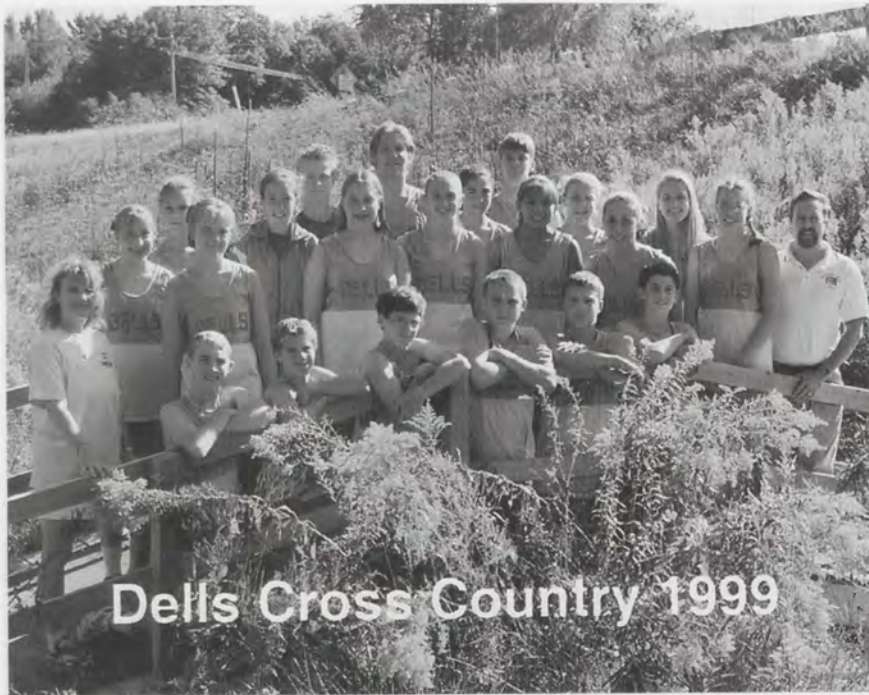

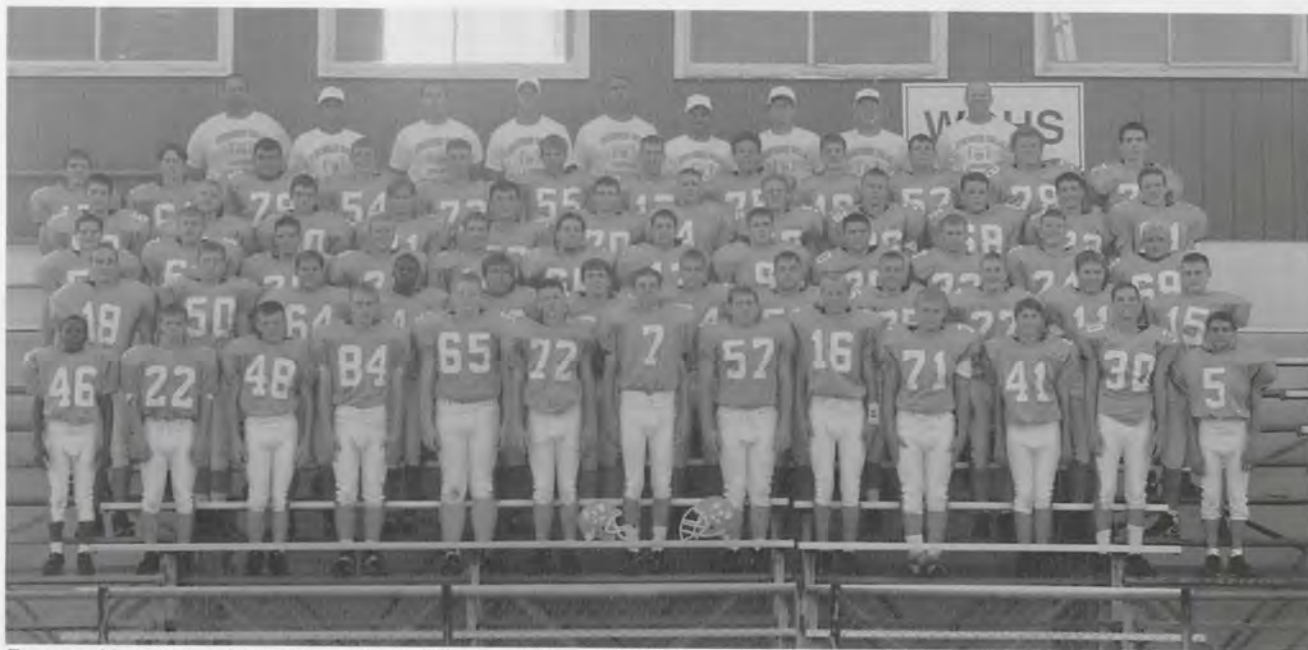
We Win With Dignity, Lose With Pride

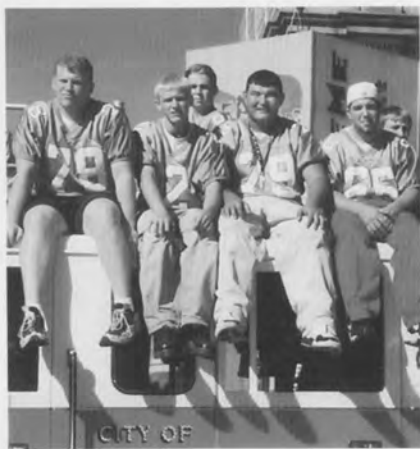

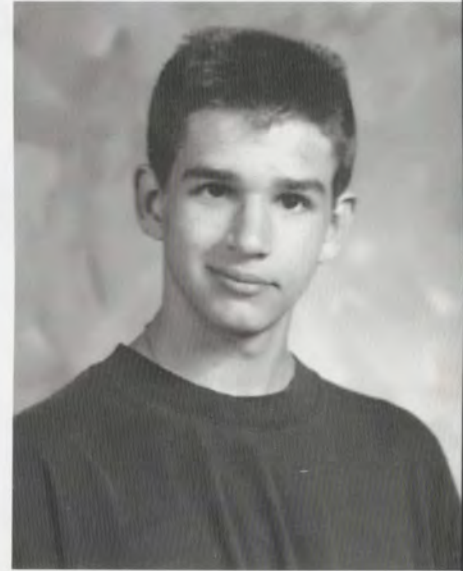

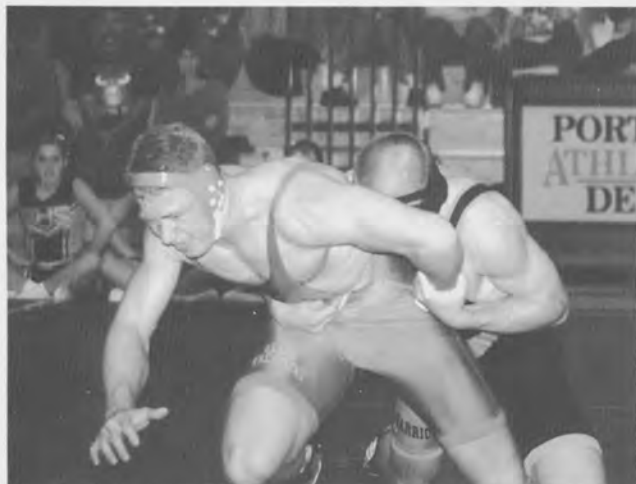
Dells Chiefs Young but Competitive

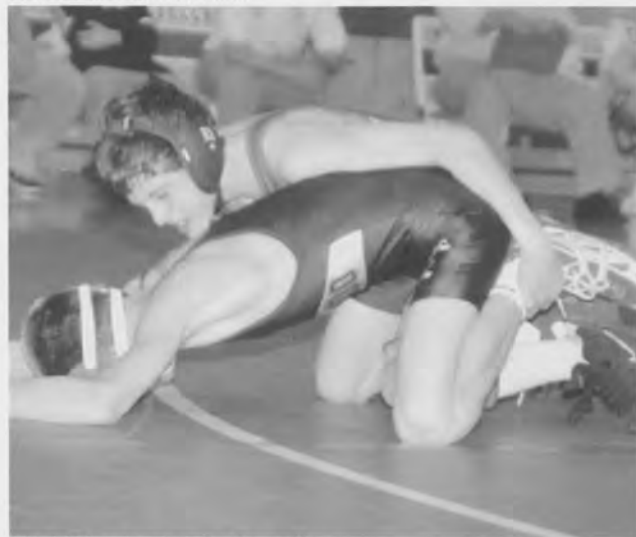
