All WDEF awards shall be made payable to the institution of post-secondary education after student provides the Wisconsin Dells Education Foundation or Community Foundation of Southern Wisconsin with proof of successful completion of a first semester (minimum of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale) and the next semester class schedule.

### Selection Process

A WDEF selection committee, made up of community members, will utilize the criteria within the School District of Wisconsin Dells Mission and WDEF Rubric to guide them in selecting up to ten (10) deserving recipients for a \$5,000 scholarship and up to twenty (20) finalists for a \$2,500 scholarship. One recipient and two finalists may be awarded in each of the ten (10) areas.

### **Award Criteria**

- 1. Be eligible to graduate with senior standing from Wisconsin Dells High School.
- 2. At graduation, attended WDHS for a minimum of 12 quarters/3 years and a 2.5 GPA.
- 3. Complete at least two courses in the department they are applying for prior to spring semester.
- 4. Complete the local/WDEF scholarship application process.

### **Department Scholarship Awards**

Seniors may apply for up to <u>three</u> WDEF Department Scholarships. Students may be the <u>recipient</u> of <u>one</u> WDEF Department Scholarship. All students may receive <u>more than one finalist scholarship.</u>

- 1. Attend the Department Scholarship workshop and/or meet with WDEF Administrator.
- Complete a local scholarship application and turn it into the Student Services Office, AND/OR
  complete a WDEF scholarship application and turn it in online. These two applications are
  separate from your electronic portfolio.

- 3. Create an electronic portfolio for each department scholarship in which you apply. Students may apply for three department scholarships. Note: Students may be the recipient of one department scholarship. Students may be a finalist of more than one department scholarship.
- 4. Portfolios must be
  - -electronic using Google Slides
  - -created with a personal Gmail account
  - -labeled with sections
  - -reviewed & verified by a mentor or teacher in the department
  - -free of any high school transcripts
  - -shareable by changing share settings to "anyone with a link can view"
  - -emailed to <u>WDEFadmin@WDHSfoundation.org</u> and <u>mfraser@sdwd.k12.wi.us</u> with the portfolio as an attachment

\*\*IMPORTANT: Shortly after you have emailed your final copy, you should receive a confirmation email. If you do NOT receive this confirmation email, it is your responsibility to contact the WDEF Administrator to ensure that the portfolio was received. Your portfolio is not considered turned in until you receive this confirmation email.

- 5. A selection committee of three people for each department will review and score the electronic portfolio. Three finalists will be chosen. The WDEF Administrator will meet with students letting them know who is a finalist.
- 6. Three finalists for each department will perform a 5 to 7 minute presentation for the selection committee. The committee will then utilize the remaining time for interview questions. The entire meeting will be a maximum of 12 minutes. It will convey your connection and growth within the department you are applying.

### Portfolio Guidelines & Content

### **Guidelines for each Section**

For each Department Scholarship portfolio, use the following guidelines to create an electronic portfolio: Only include the following six sections in your portfolio.

Section 1: Why this Department? - 150 words or less

Section 2: High School Resume - (same as local application)

Sections 3-5: Connect Inspire Achieve - Everyone. Everyday.

Section 3 Artifact: Connect- A form listing all courses and experiences - reviewed and verified

Reflection: 500 words or less

Section 4 Artifact: Inspire- Something already completed in a course or related experience.

Reflection: 500 words or less

Section 5 Artifact: Achieve- Something already completed in a course or related experience.

Reflection: 500 words or less

Section 6: Personal Growth - 300 words or less

### Content for each Section

**Section 1**: Explain why you are applying for this specific department. In 150 words or less, describe what motivates you to apply for this specific department. Why is it important to you?

Section 2: High School Resume - (same as local application)

### Section 3: Connect- Artifact One & Reflection

Artifact one is a form listing all experiences related to this department that will be reviewed and verified. (Form - located at the end of this packet and on Google Classroom)

- -List: all courses you have taken in this department- please indicate if it is an AP or Dual Credit Course. In addition, list organizations, experiences, or activities you were a part of that are related to this specific department.
- -Review: meet with a teacher in the department and ask them to review your list.
- -Verify: ask the teacher to please sign the verification form. This your Connect Artifact and will be turned in with your final portfolio.

Reflection: In 500 words or less address the following items.

- Describe how these courses, organizations, experiences, and/or activities have helped you **Connect** within the department.
- -Consider your entire list. Were there any fears or challenges you faced? How did you overcome them?

### Section 4: Inspire- Artifact Two & Reflection

- Display artifact.

Reflection: In 500 words or less, address the following items.

- Explain what the artifact is and why you chose it.
- Describe how it is an example of **Inspire** within that department. It can be how you were inspired by someone or something or how you inspired others.
- Discuss additional experiences that have inspired you within the department, and how they have impacted you or how they have inspired you to impact the lives of others.

### Section 5: Achieve- Artifact Three & Reflection

- Display artifact. YOU MAY NOT USE SCORES, TRANSCRIPTS, or GRADES.

Reflection: In 500 words or less, address the following items.

- Explain what the artifact is and why you chose it.
- Describe how it is an example of **Achieve** within that department.
- Discuss additional achievements you have accomplished within the department, and how they have impacted you. This is your opportunity to share your definition of achievement. It can be academic, but it can also be overcoming challenges to create a confidence you now possess.

### Section 6: Personal Growth- In 300 words or less, address the following items.

- Explain the ways you have grown due to your involvement in the department. Include specific examples of lessons or experiences to further explain.
- What skills have you acquired from this department that you will utilize during this next chapter in life?

### Artifacts

These **artifacts** are the **evidence** you will use to explain how the department you are applying for has had a substantial **impact** on you. Choose these items carefully.

### Artifacts must

- -Reflect the department for which you are applying.
- -Be something you have created or experienced. (NOT a letter someone else has written about you.)
- -Exhibit different types of learning experiences within that department. (Should NOT be repetitive.)
- -Display work from multiple classes, if possible, to demonstrate time and effort invested within the department.
- -Be approved by a teacher in the department or WDEF Administrator as a solid example of an artifact.

### Artifacts should NOT be

- -someone else's work or someone else's evaluation of you.
- -Repetitive.
- -Missing. Complete portfolios have three artifacts-your verification form, and two additional artifacts.
- -Vague or unexplained.
- -Utilized in more than one department portfolio

### Artifacts can be

- -From a course you have taken within the department.
- -From a club, team, or organization that is connected to the department which you are applying for.
