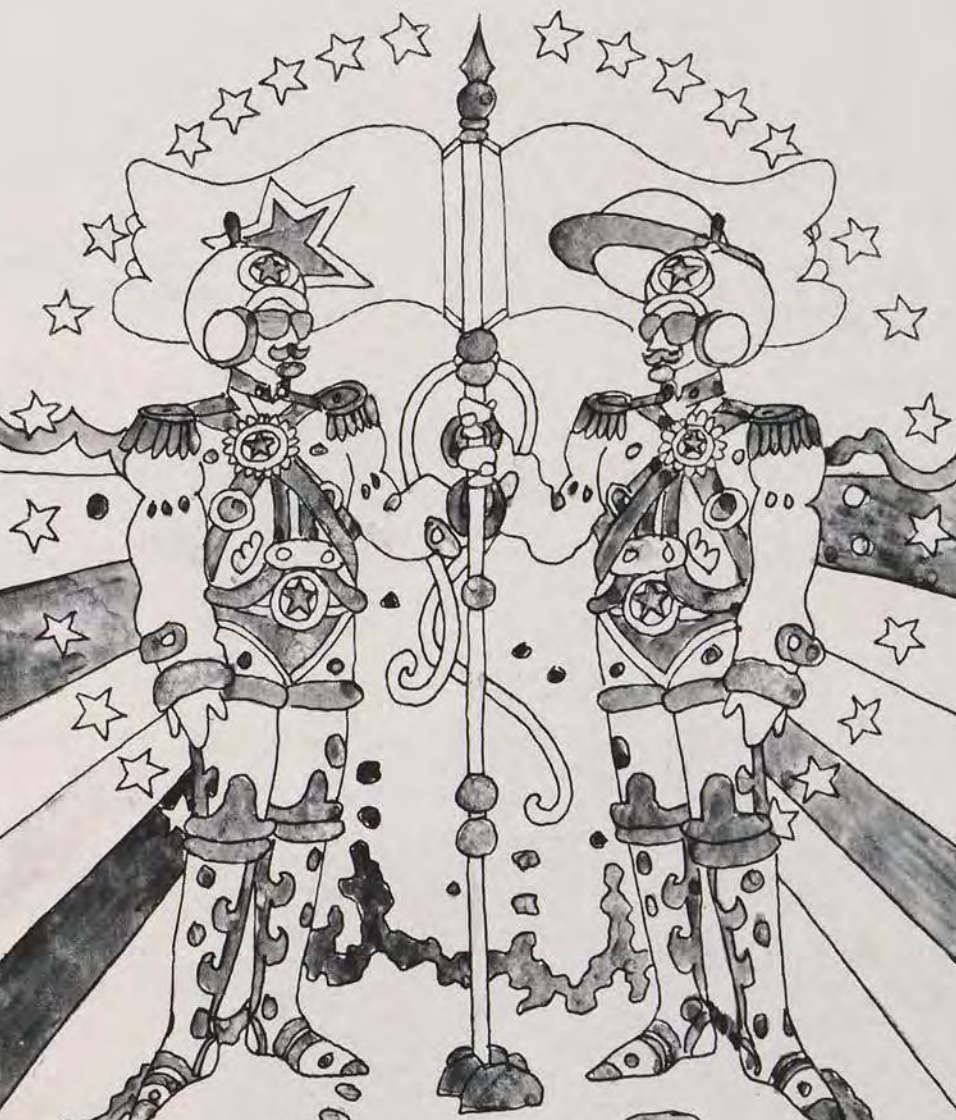

After six years of grade school, you can go to seven different kinds of high schools. You and your teacher usually decide to what kind of high school you go. There is a very great difference between the high school and it depends basically on your intelligence (learning abilities??) to which kind of high school you go.

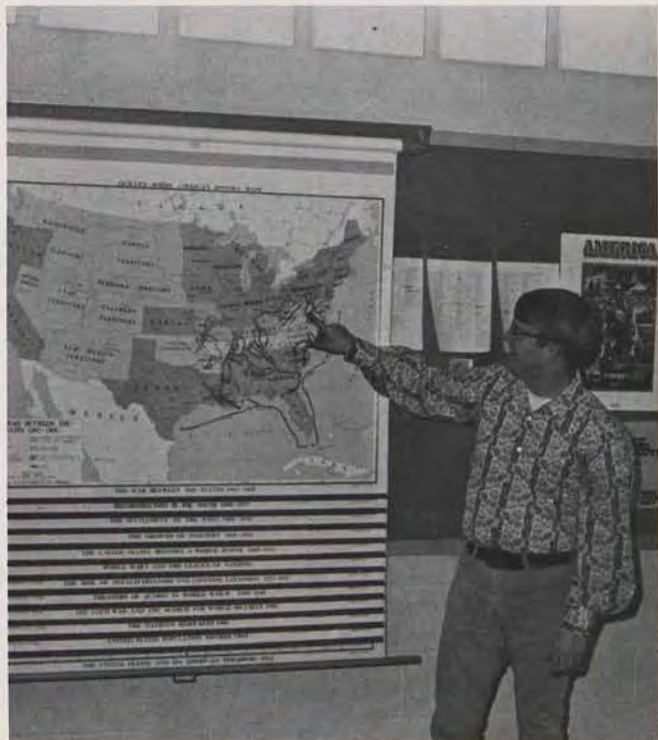

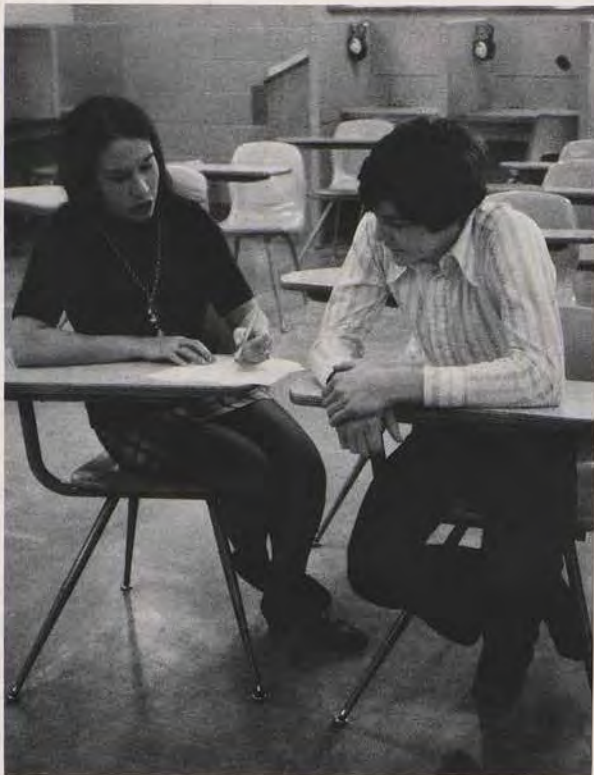

Football 1972 will be long remembered. The Gridders record was the best in modern history and the best ever in the South Central Conference. This team didn't have any superstars who stood out, but was a team with all around balance at every position. This balance and as much unity as a team could possibly have, were the main reasons for the title.

The first victory was perhaps the sweetest as the Chiefs entered the game as 14 point underdogs against a Baraboo team with a 19 game winning streak. In a tough defensive game, the Chiefs pulled out a 14-6 victory. This game got the team rolling for the remainder of the season.

The team kept the momentum going the following week as they trounced hapless Sparta 24-6.

The showdown with Tomah was next and the Chiefs found themselves down 13-0 at half time. However the team showed it's character in the second half and rallied back to do everything but win, and lost a heartbreaker 13-12.

Still in doldrums from the Tomah game the squad had to come from behind to beat Sauk Prairie 14-7.

Portage came to the Dells undefeated. However from the outset the Chiefs proved to be the better, as they played one of their better games of the season and whipped the Warriors 33-13.

Homecoming at Reedsburg was ruined by the Chiefs. In a defensive game the Dells shutout the Beavers 12-0.

Homecoming "72" was next and the Chiefs conquered the challengers from Black River Falls 28-20.

Game eight was played in a downpour against Adams. The Gridders exploded for their biggest point output of the season with a 40-6 trouncing.

The Chiefs put it all together for the last time against Mauston. The Chiefs played a near flawless game and blew the Golden Eagles off the field. This great trouncing along with a Tomah loss earned the Dells the title.

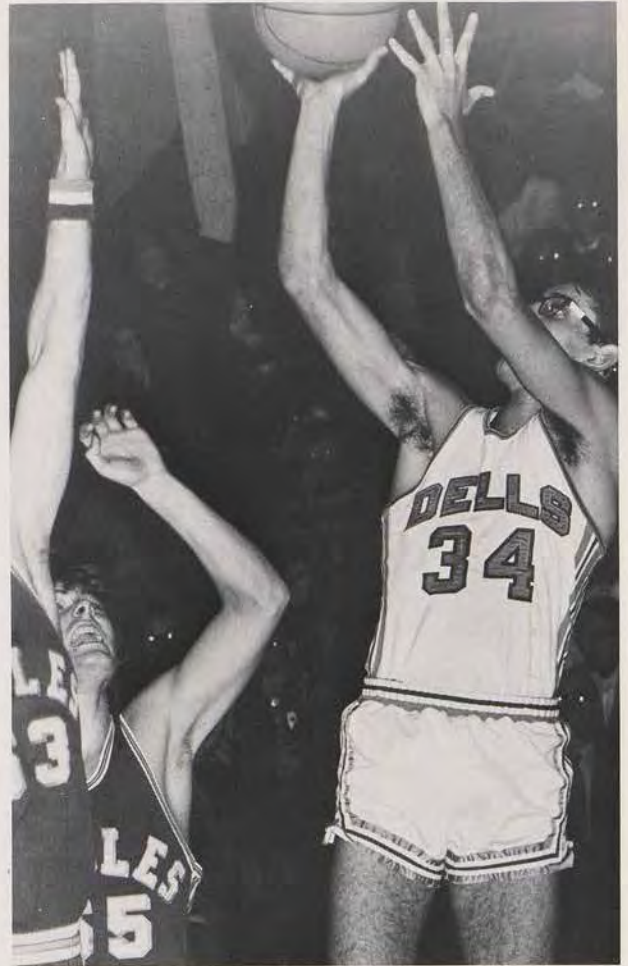
The Chiefs won their first three tournament games, which enabled them to capture the Regional title. With this

## Grapplers Have Excellent Season

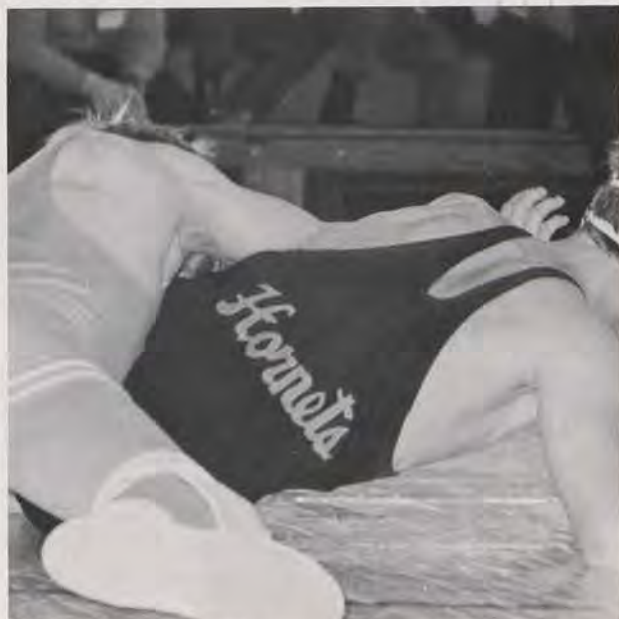
Dells wrestlers enjoyed their best season ever in 1973.

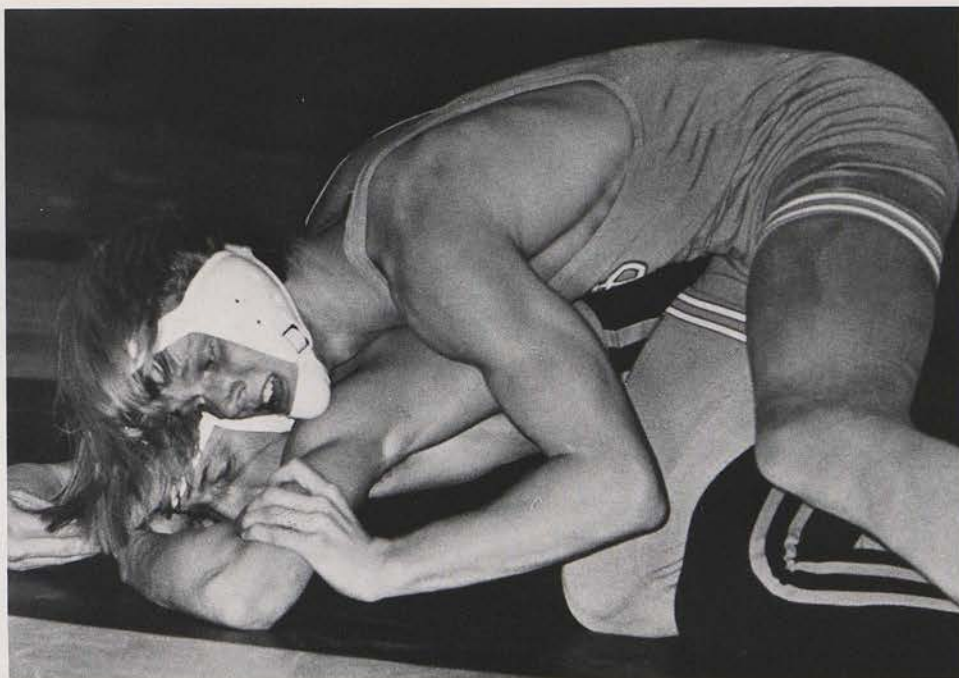

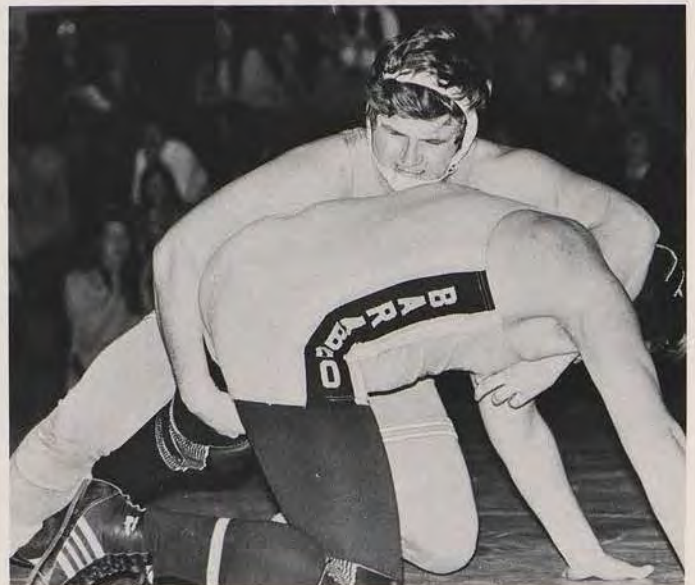

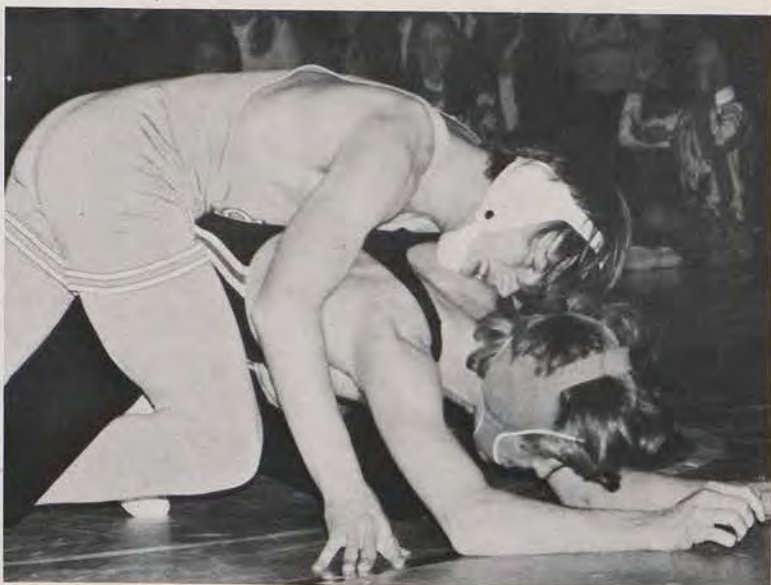

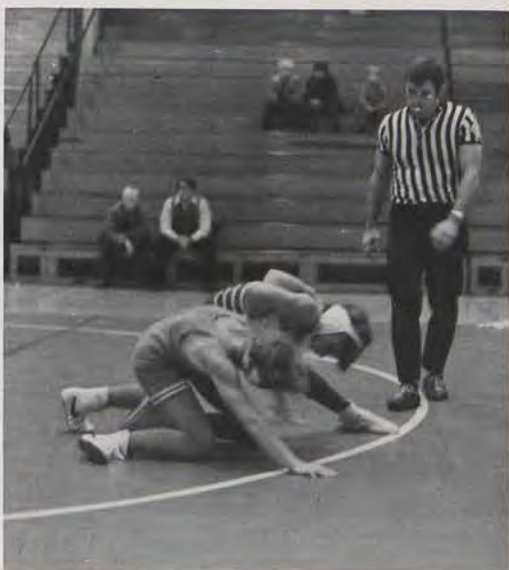

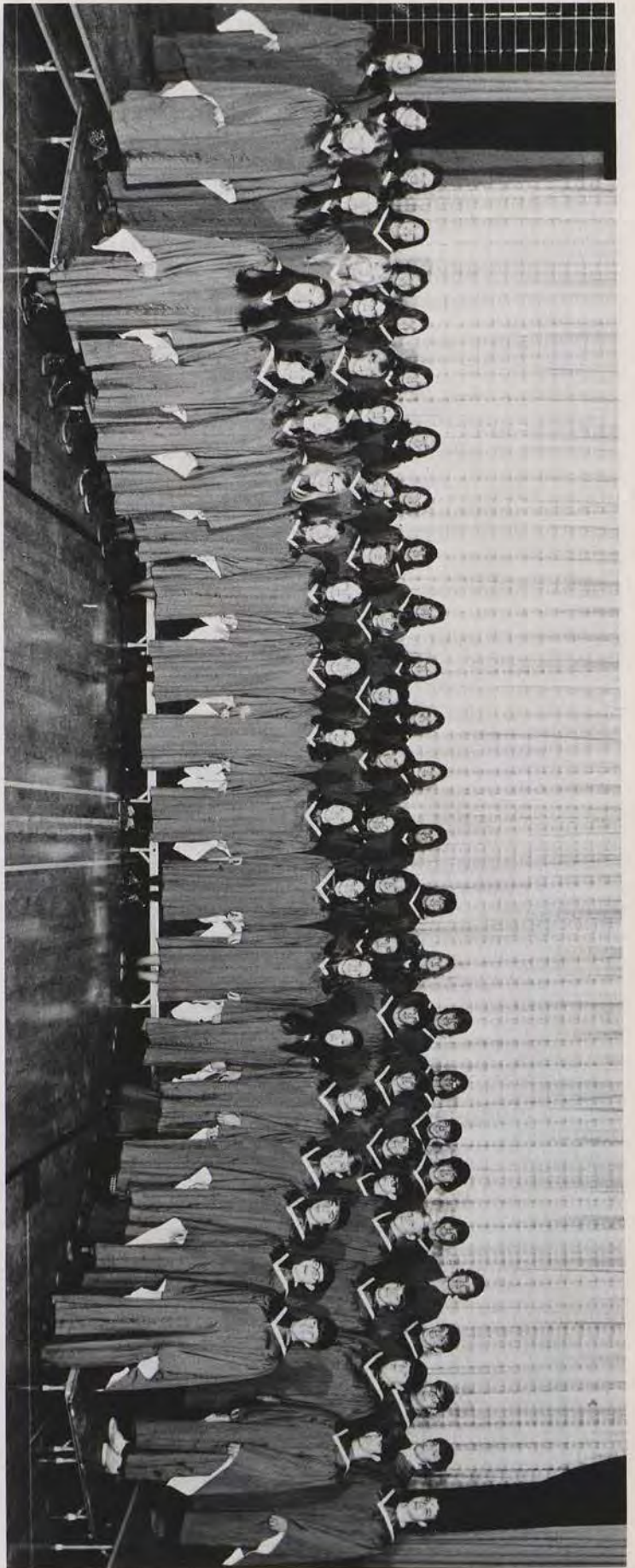

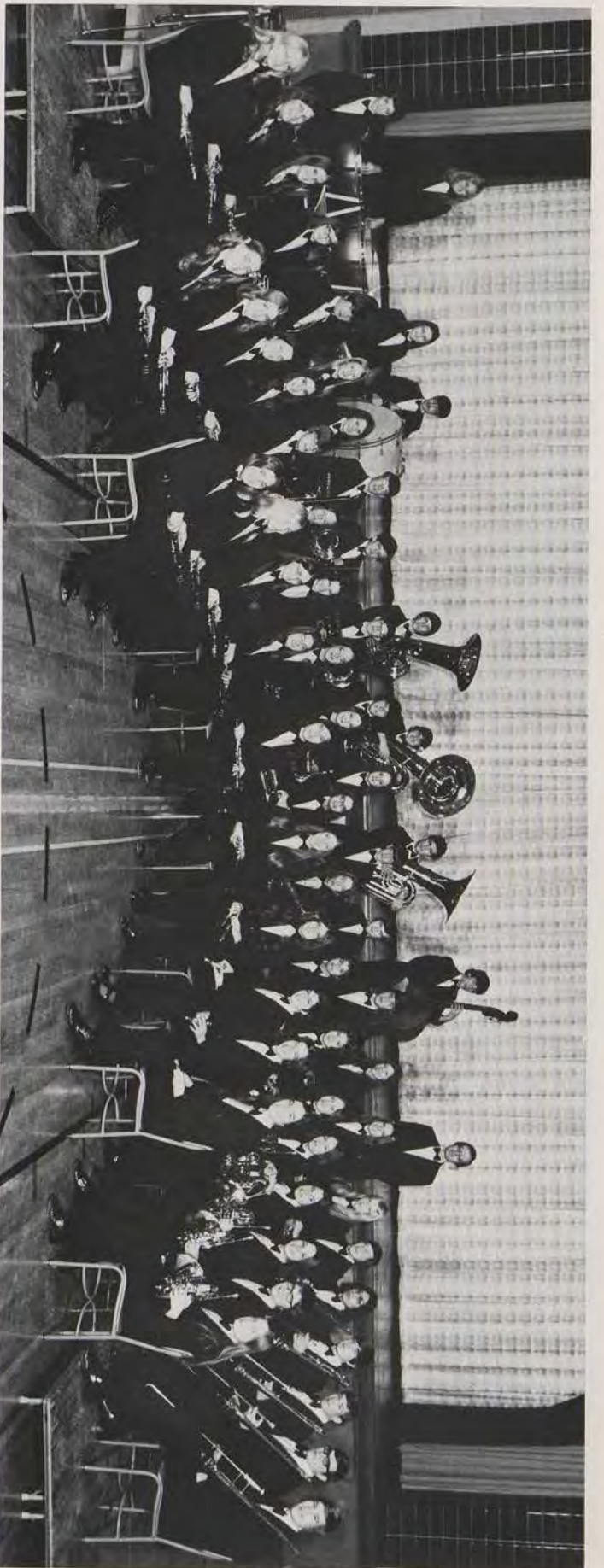

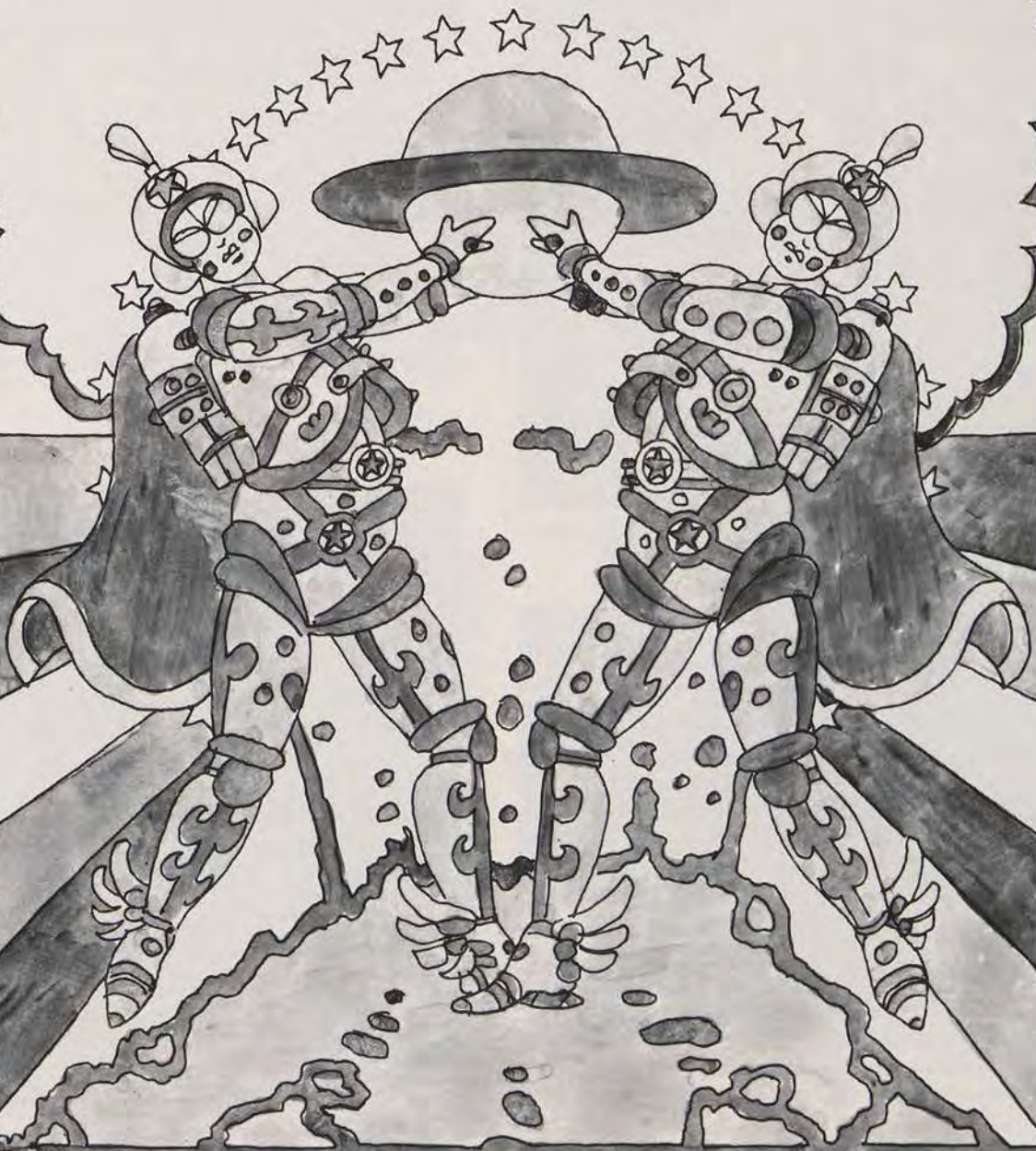
