



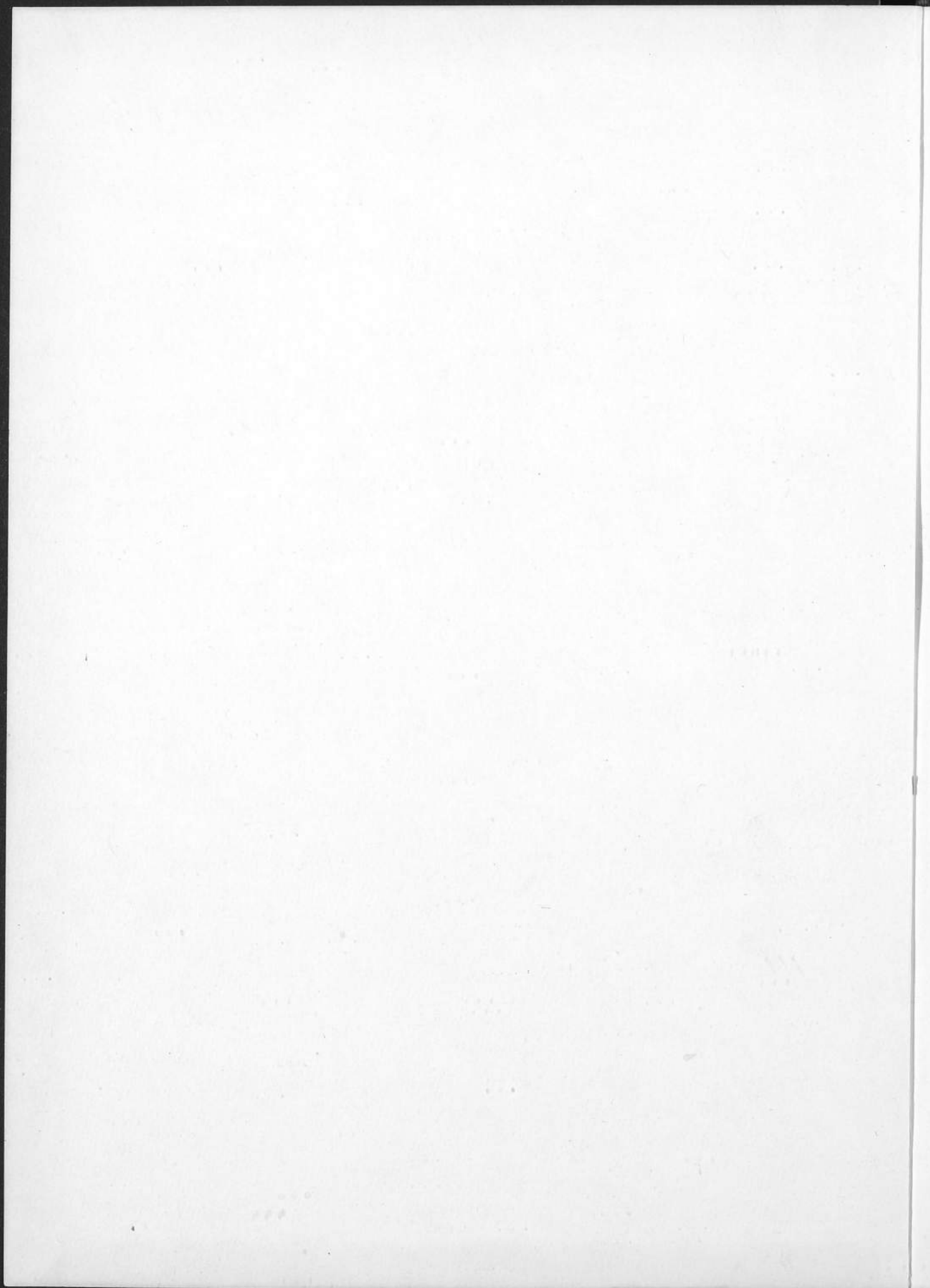



Foreword

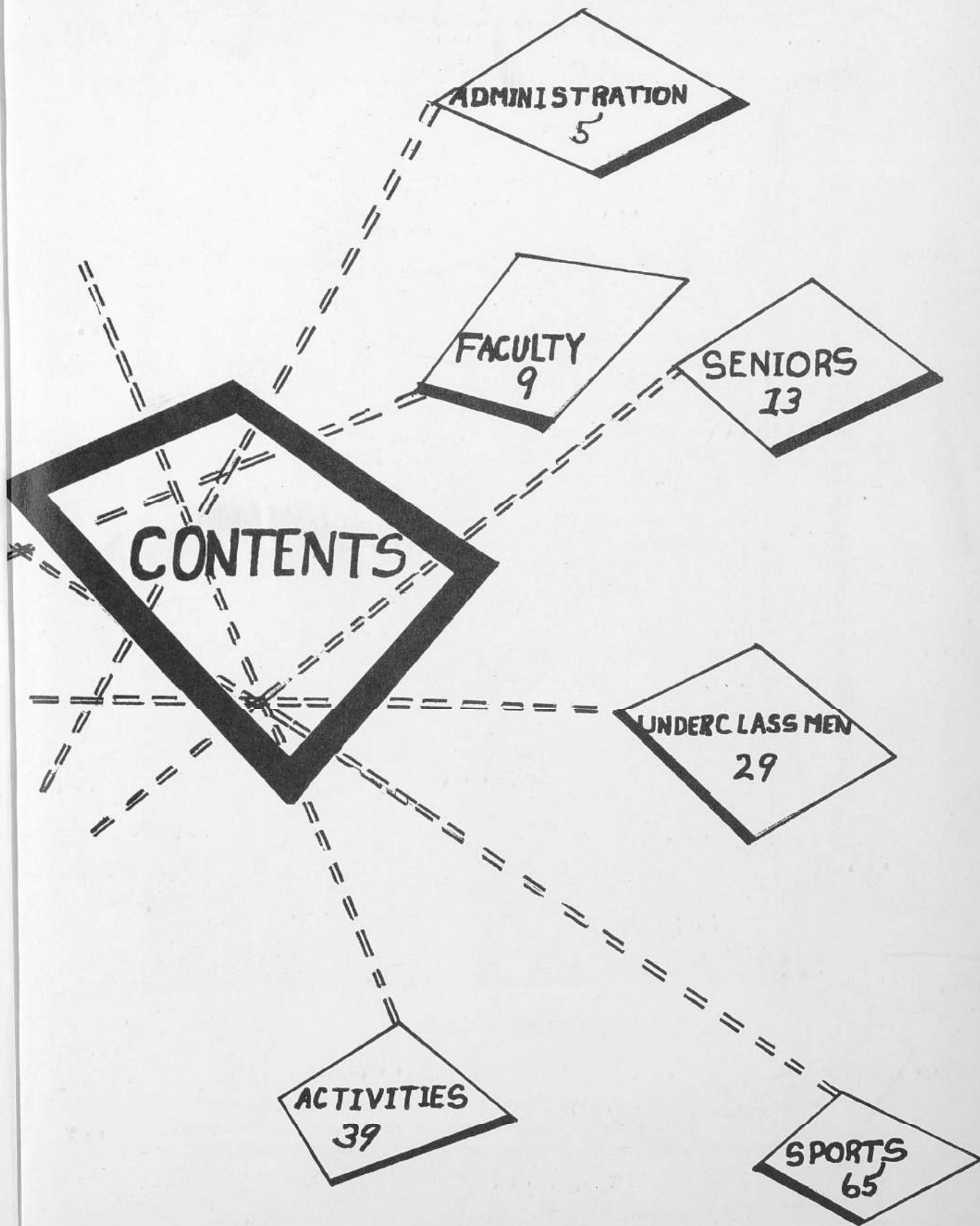

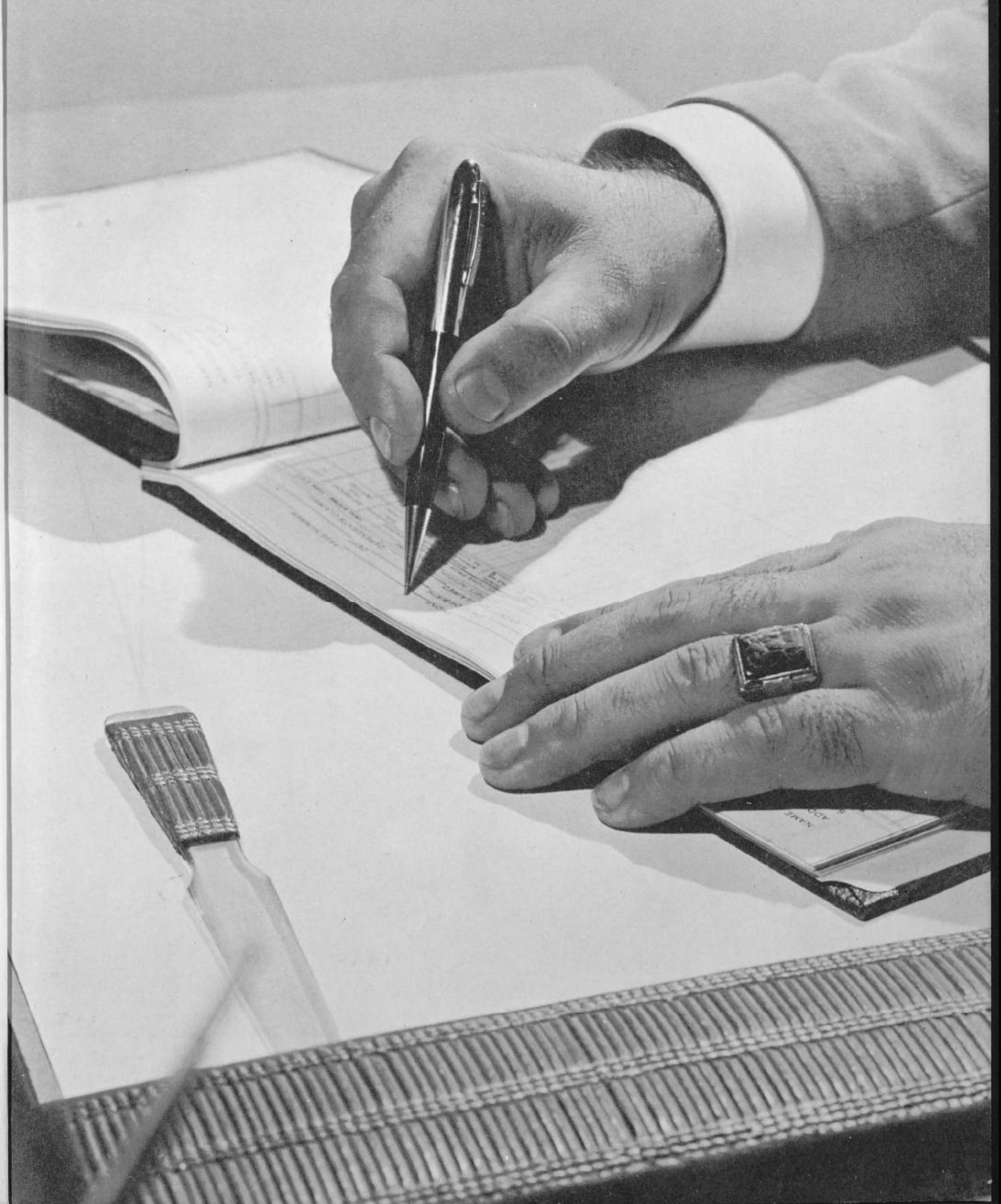


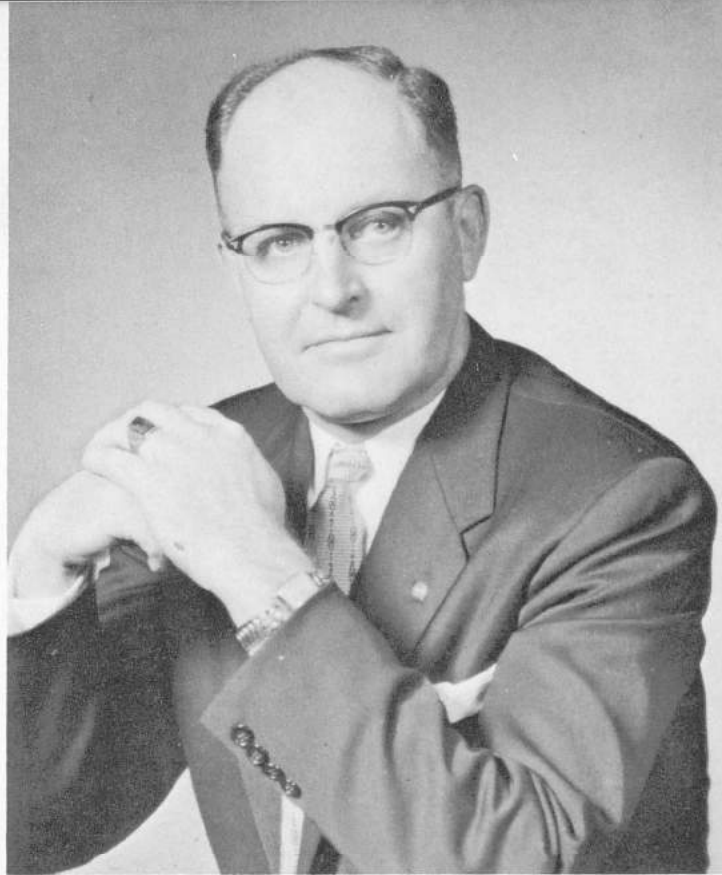


Donald Skarda

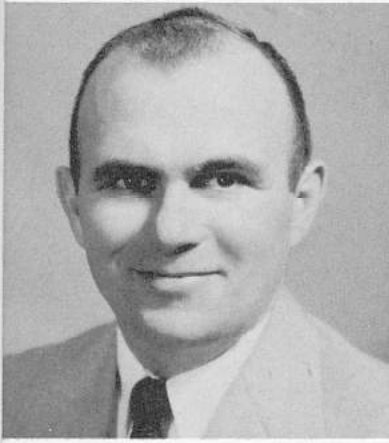

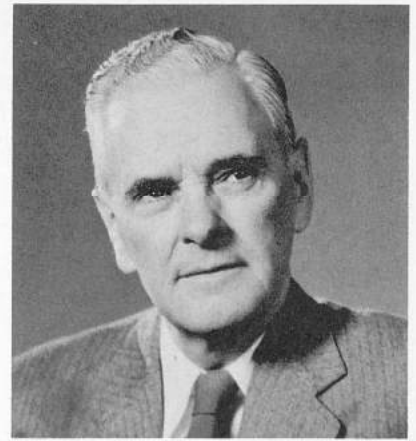

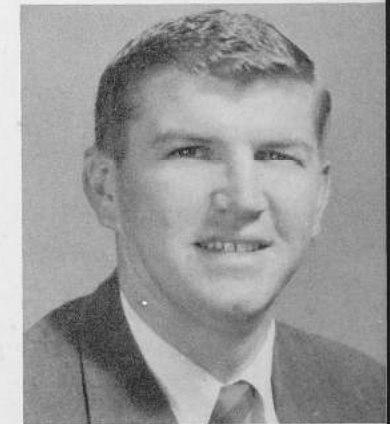

Class History

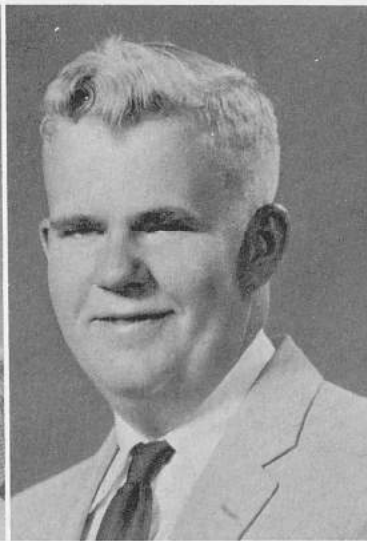

As juniors, we participated in several high school activities. Two members of our class, Barbara Michael and Jeanie Kaiser, were cheerleaders. The Homecoming Queen was Mary Newell. The junior boys, Jack Anchor, Dennis Hickethier, Don O'Neil, John Morse, Sheldon Hansen, Adalbert Rehbein, Julian Anderson, Loren Lewis, Dave Nelson, Dick Marsich, Terry Haines, and Jerry Dunne, put on the fine play STALAG 17--the girls helped a little, too. Our Prom was called "Harbor Lights." Dennis Hickethier and Rose Heidel reigned as King and Queen of "Harbor Lights." To help guide us through our junior year, we elected Dennis Hickethier as president, Dick Marsich as vice-president, Mary Naber as secretary, and Emily Fulton as treasurer.

At last we were seniors and the BIG WHEELS in school. At our class elections, which were held like national elections, we voted in Norbert Bremer as president, John Morse as vice-president; Ruth Luke as secretary, and Sandy Wegert as treasurer. Our student council members were Tom Hosely and Marie Nemitz. With Jeff Wimmer as Homecoming King and a game score of 13 to 6 in our favor, Homecoming was a big success.

Now, it is May, 1957, and we are leaving Union High School. As we walk up the steps to the stage to receive our diplomas, we realize that this is the final step in our high school career, but at the same time the beginning of a new life for us.

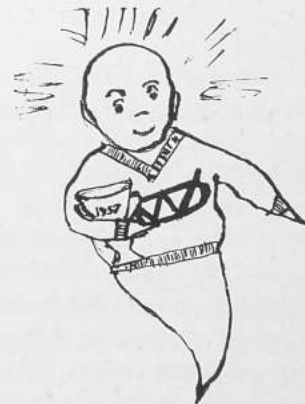

Mrs. Slocum, the advisor, has succeeded in establishing an orderly library and has tried to put its facilities to effective use.



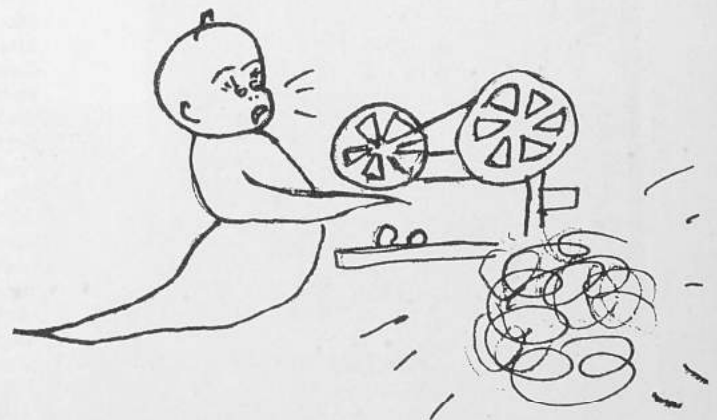
