Life's journey is circular; it appears the years don't carry us away from our friends, they return us to them.

















































The Dells moved on to Regionals, placing fourth out of thirteen teams. Earning a trip to Sectionals, the team placed sixth out of eight teams to end the season. Sean Bahr attributes a strong mental game



to the team's success. "The physical aspect of golf, the swing, is often hindered by the mental blocks," Sean explained. He praised Coach Hoenecke

for the "one- on-one" support he gave to his team. Golfers receiving awards for the '96 season were Eric Gilliland, Coach's Award, and Jeff Capelle, MVP. Sean Bahr achieved most improved and made second team All-Conference.






All good things must come to an end as did the courtyard-held Faire. We witnessed the passing of an era and look forward in anticipation to the next chapter in the Renaissance saga. . .

Postseason honors consisted of two second team and three honorable mention selections. All eyes are shifted to next season. Head Coach Bruce Ouinton explained, "We've got a good group of younger class guys and if they can stay motivated, we'll be much improved."
















Leader of the Pack rocks full house

Leader of the Pack, is a story set in the



" Getinvolved in extra curricular activities; it is an excellent way to get to know the kids really well."These words of advice are expressed to new teachers by WDHS retiree Gisela Hamm. Mrs. Hamm

retired from teaching following a memorable 30 year career in education. Hamm's early classroom experiences range from those in vocational education to teaching at a school for girls. For sixteen years, she substituted before becoming a full time English teacher at Dells High. After nearly twelve years, Hamm said she would truly miss the special moment in class when every thing "clicks" and learning takes place.

Hamm was an extremely dedicated teacher and possessed a long-term commitment to her community. She graduated from Sheboygan North High School and has seen the changing eras of educational trends. Her comment on changes which she noted over the years was centered on the idea of "strict dress codes for everyone, to seeing some very bizarre attire." On the whole, clothing choices are now much more comfortable. Also she commented that kids of her younger teaching career were, "very respectful, but now some kids lack respect for each other and for adults."

You could say Hamm's forte is English. After graduating from Sheboygan, she enrolled at the University of Wisconsin-Madison and earned her Bachelor of Science degree in education. English was one of her three minors along with political science and history.

Her plan for retirement includes continuing to be active in community affairs such as the Art Association and Historical Society. She hopes to travel and spend time with members of her family.

Hamm sums up her whole teaching career in one word, challenge. "I always tried to challenged kids to reach more and not settle for second best." Mrs. Hamm is respected by many, but most of all her co-workers and students at WDHS.

Mrs. Potter

In 1959, a young lady came to Wisconsin Dells High School with a strong ambition to start teaching in the special education program. Thirtyseven years later we honor the retirement of Mrs. Gerry Potter.



As a child,

Potter was intrigued with helping others and while her dream was to be an artist, she chose teaching. She devoted most of her teaching career to children who are cognitively disabled and enjoyed every minute of it. Special Olympics was a special time for Potter and her kids to share common goals of doing their best and working together as a team. She feels a closeness to people who need extra help and encouragement. Potter's niece was her student while she was growing up. Later in life, her daughter became physically handicapped. Her whole life has been affected by her gift for teaching.

After teaching K-8 for many years, she moved to the Dells High School to start the alternative education program. Former Director of Pupil Services, Ron Piekarski, was supportive and encouraged her to teach special education. The more she taught, the more involved she became. Potter earned her Bachelor of Science Degree in Education from U.W. Stevens Point and her Masters in Special Education from U.W. LaCrosse. The years passed, and she continued her educational pursuit until retirement.

Potter said if she had one more day left to teach, she would enjoy her students and let them know how much she enjoyed teaching them. She sums up her whole teaching career in one word*helping* because she cared for each one of her students "as if they were her own."

When her kids found out Mrs. Potter was retiring, their reactions varied. One student in particular was very saddened. With teary eyes, she said, "Mrs. Potter was my favorite teacher ever. Why did she have to leave me?" Potter was truly loved by her students, a love that will be with her always. We bid a farewell to Mrs. Potter as we look back on her years of committment to those who needed her help.
