## Bailey Claims State Championship

Guess follows close behind

All eyes looked upon Laina Bailey as she was the first individual female athlete in Wisconsin Dells history to ever walk away from a state competition with a gold medal around her neck. Joining her at state was David Guess. He competed in the 200 -meter dash. David was disapointed he didn't make finals, but he achieved his season long goal of a time under 23 seconds.

As Laina started the season, much was expected of this young junior athlete. From the beginning, Laina anticipated returning to the state meet. But this year, 3rd place was not going to be enough. Having this mind-set, Laina dedicated all her efforts into training for the 400 -meter dash.

Laina also took on a new challenge of competing in the 300 -meter low hurdles. With the help of a previous track coach, Laina's father, she began the endless hours of practice. As the season got underway their efforts began to pay off. It wasn't always pretty, but Laina began to improve.

As Laina returned to LaCrosse all the sites were familiar, but this year she knew what to expect. Laina's nerves were shot and her stomach was in knots. Saturday's qualifying meet didn't go as well as anticipated, but now the end was near. There was only one last race to determine who the best was. "I knew when the gun went off that I had to get out hard and keep the lead," said Laina. All of Laina's dedication and hard work was about to pay off. When the gun went off, she exploded out of the blocks and never looked back. She ran what seemed to be an eternity, but ended up only being 60 seconds. Within those next 60 seconds, Laina became the new state champion in the 400 -meter dash. After the race, when Laina was asked how she felt about winning, she replied enthusiastically, "When you win, nothing hurts!" Reality had proven itself. Laina Bailey was a champion.

## HoChunk Nations Gaming Contributions to the Community

Over $90 \%$ of all money cycled through HoChunk Nation slot machines gets paid back to the customer.

As policy the HoChunk Nation gaming Gacilities do NOT cash welfare checks.

On average, HoChunk Nation gaming customers are middle income, middle age to older couples with no children at home, a budgeted income, and enjoy the safe and fun environment of casinos.

Over 15,000 jobs in the state of Wisconsin are provided by Indian Gaming facilities.

The HoChunk Nation employs almost 3,000 people, approximately $60 \%$ are non-Native Americans.

Two-thirds of the HoChunk Nation's work force are employed in the bingo halls and casinos.

The HoChunk Nation supplies low to middle income jobs in the Wisconsin communities of Wisconsin Dells, Jackson County and Wood County.

Most of employees' salaries go to taxes and local small business for living purchases such as groceries, appliances, vehicles and affordable housing, etc.

On average, jobs with the HoChunk Nation pay $\$ 2$ more per hour than other local businesses for similar positions.

The HoChunk Nation offers competitive benefits which include options in health, life, dental and optometry care.

The HoChunk Nation paid over 25 million dollars in taxes last year to the state and federal government from enterprises, employees and membership.

Since 1992, the HoChunk Nation has contributed over FIVE MILLION DOLIARS to worthy causes, including, but not limited to, local high schools, local fire rescue and police departments, the American Cancer Society, the Children's Miracle Network, and the American Legion.

Over $\$ 270,000$ has been donated in charity to local fire, ambulance, rescue, and police departments. Note: this does not include what the HoChunk Nation pays in service costs to our businesses.

Expansion of Wood County water systems was recently approved by the HoChunk Nation Legislature, including a new water tower and an almost one million dollar improvement to the current system. This will benefit the area community, including a day care center and an elderly feeding site.

Road and airport improvements contributed to or paid for by the HoChunk Nation have taken place in Jackson; Wood and Sauk Counties over the past four years since HoChunk Nation casinos came into being.

Disaster relief in a number of Wisconsin counties has been donated including fire, tornado and flood relief.

Contributions to organizations handling family issues (including domestic abuse relief and D.A.R.E. programming) are well over $\$ 50,000$. This does NOT include the many volunteer hours contributed by employees and tribal members to these causes.

The IloChunk Nation con tributed a multi-million dollar waste water treatment facility in Jackson County, of which the State of Wisconsin Department of Corrections uses.

Not all Indian Tribes share the same rights or opportunities on Native American related treaty issues (like Indian Gaming, spearfishing or rice harvesting) that may have been set up with federal or state governments through time.
The HoChunk Nation does not have treaties granting rights to spearfishing or rice harvesting. We do, however, compact with the State of Wisconsin for the right to operate Indian Casinos.
