



















Victories were hard to come by early in the year, because the team had to learn to play as a unit in order to win. With only three starting seniors returning, underclassmen had to take a large amount of responsibility. Senior Trent LaBrenz assumed leadership in the dugout as well on the field. By his teammates he was voted MVP and captain. Josh Mawbey also played well by leading the team in batting average (.386).

These two lead the entire infield that was composed of young, but talented underclassmen. As the team got more experience together they began to work as a whole. The Chiefs got their first win by taking the Weston Tournament and later played tough against Portage, a team that easily handled the Dells early on. At the next tournament in Loyal the Dells beat the host, but unfortunately lost a good game to a tough Barron squad. The team finished the year strong, but only gained one more win against Adams. The Chiefs finished the season with a 4-15 mark.

Homecoming vs Adams would also be a heart breaker, losing 36-6. The Seniors had heart, courage, an determination to win, with this and luck the team can only grow next year.



Mr. Geyman was not just a great teacher, but a great friend as well. Mr Geyman had a tremendous influence on hundreds of students, during his teaching span at Wisconsin Dells High.

Mr. Geyman traveled quite a path before landing in the Dells. A graduate of UW-Whitewater's class of '65, he set out to Delafield St. John's Military School. After a few years, Mr. Geyman toured a variety of teaching postions from Mahtomedi High, Minnesota; to New Berlin West High; and even to the Air Force. Finally after all this movement, Mr. Geyman landed in Wisconsin Dells. His teaching genius was first used at the grade school level, but later he moved to the high school in the fall of 1979. At the high school he specialized in Geometry, Algebra 1 and 2, Math 1 and 2, and PreAlgebra.

He also was involved in many extra-curricular activies, making WDHS stand out from others. A member of the Wisconsin Mathematics Council, he was on the committee that started the South Central Conference Math Meet, and initiated the Dells participation in the Wisconsin Mathematics League. Mr. Geyman was also a dedicated and respected basketball coach. Mr. Geyman filled a variety of different coaching spots from 8th and 9th grades, to Junior Varsity, to Varsity Assitant.

Of his years at WDHS Mr. Geyman said, "I have many fond memories of students and teachers from the twenty-four years at the Dells." Mr. Geyman was a very dedicated teacher that earned students respect. He got the best out of his students, and the students brought the best out of him.





Meanwhile three others are hot on Harry's tail. Annabelle Glick (Danielle Soma), a meek, humble woman who volunteers her time at the Universal Dog Home of Brooklyn, watches Harry closely to make sure he follows the guidelines of the will. Throughout the show she wished for him to mess up so that the money goes to the poor, needy dogs, a worthy cause. Domonique DuMonaco (Diana Spargo), a graceful, French Las Vagas performer, happens to "bump" into Vinnie, and lures him into including her in the chase. The other pursuer turned out to be quite a surprise. The real Tony Henden (Matt Beard), disguised as his best pal, Luigi Guadi, whom Rita shot in a heated moment of jealous rage, supervises Harry from a distance. Eventually, Tony is forced to come clean, and admits to using Harry and his best friend's stuffed corpse as a shield for transporting the six million dollars he and Rita embezzled from her husband's casino into another country. And amazingly, at the end of the show, everyone is paired up; Vinnie and Dominique plan to escape to a remote island, Rita snags her man Tony once and again, and Harry and Annabelle through spending many trying hours together fall in love. The show closes as Annabelle and Harry share a sweet and innocent kiss. Kathy Spargo, Marti Fults, Katrina Kmak, Lena Spargo, Sonya Rowe, and Dan Borud, an extremely talented orchestra under the direction of Mr. Spargo and his flashy bow-tie, lead the entire cast in the stunning musical performance. All in all, "Lucky Stiff" was an entertaining and star studded show.










WISCONSIN DELLS WRESTLING FEDERATION






