Adams and in a remarkable conference championship over-time game in Wisconsin Dells. They also demolished a non-conference rival Reedsburg.



Next year the Dells Dolphins are hoping to have a larger turnout of swimmers and get some more first places filled at the conference championship swim meet.





enduring FREEDOM














