



















Track and Field

Although the boys team did not win a meet, they came very close and did a great job with the number of people they had. They received 3rd at the Heather Johnson Invite, 3rd in Conference, and 2nd in Regionals. While at conference, the girls team brought home many gold medals in the hands of Taylor Hickey in the 1600 meter run, Becky Madsen in the shot put and discus, 4x100 meter relay (T. Myklebust, J. 


OLD, OLD BONES A




GLOBAL WARMING DEBATE ≺




PATRIARCH PASSES Y


GOOD-BYE TO THE KING OF POP ◀

Beyonce Knowles won six Grammy awards for her album I Am... Sasha Fierce. The song "Single Ladies (Put a Ring On It)" became a number one hit, and the music video was one of the more memorable, parodied images of the year.
