From Washington we traveled to the "piece de' resistance," New York City. Who could ever forget all of the "X"-rated theaters, crazy drivers who








The Spirit of Success






Chiefs Stride Season . . . Sprint on to State


The State Champion Dells track team readied itself for the forthcoming meet. As if on one, the forecast read chance of rain, coul temperatures, and gusting winds.

Despite poor weather conditions at most of the meets, the Dells track team kept on pace with the State champion team from the year before. Coach Johnson, pleased with the team's early performances at West Relays and the Meet of Champions, predicted a successful season was ahead.

Loaded with ability, the thinclads took disappointing seconds in two tri angular meets during mid-season. Larger meets being their strong point, the Chiefs came back and won their own invitational and stormed through the Conference meet, defeating second place Baraboo by over fitty points. The Chiefs again had a hometrack advantage as the Conference meet was moved from Adams-Friendship to the Dells because of poor farilities.

The boys' ream, led by captains Grady Arendsee and Troy Nelson, didn't slow down, and strided to the Columbus Regionals to take first place. Two days later, the Chiefs traveled to the Mount Horeb Sectionals, where they placed second and qualified eight people for the State meet.




Coach Capelle explained, "Our



On the first day of practice, the 1984 Foorball Chiefs were greeted by a chalkboard extending its welcome to the future S.C.C. Co-Champions. During the remainder of their prep careers, 15 seniors and other members of the varsity squad hared down to fulfill the prophecy.

Farly on in a lackloster non-conference game against Jefferson, the Dells lost 6-0, showing a promising defense and an uncertain offense. After a win agaisot Adams, the Chiefs lost to Nekoova in one of a number of games that came to be called "championship" games. In previous years, the Chiefs might have collapsed after such a loss, but this team believed that it *deserved* to win. This was a major difference between this year's squad and teams from years ago.

Senior guidaoce, along with co captains John Vernon and Willie Wimmer, helped the Chiefs put together a consecutive sia game winning streak. They began by shutting out Sparta and Portage. Then, in the waning seconds of the game, the Chiefs beat Reedsburg with a gamesaving interception by Willie Wimmer. Finally, against Baraboo, a punt return for a touchdown sent the game into double overtime. This strong finish earned the Chiefs, along with Reedsburg, a Co-Champion South Central Conference title and a berth in the play-offs.

The "second season" saw the Chiefs coopter Kiel, withing their first playoff game in Dells history, and finish up their season with a loss to Oconto Falls in the State semi-finals.

In a season of bright spots, one of the major disappointments was the tack of Dells players selected to the Conference team. The Chiefs placed only three players: David Anderson, C: John Vernon, OT; and Pere Johnson, DT; who also was named to the all-district team.

Coach Kuhl summed up the season by saying, "We were considered a darkhorse at best. To get as far as we did and succeed at what we set out to do was quite an accomplishment, with a lot of credit going to the leadership and determination demonstrated by the seniors. I bope that the athletes can take what they've learned and experienced this football season and apply it to situations that they may be confronted with later on in their lives."

What's new in the WDHS Athletic Department? It's Girls' softball! For nearly two years, girls have been trying to get a softball program into interscholastic competition.




DAR/Good Citizenship

The high point of the year came early when the Corporation was invited to represent Wisconsin at


