History Repeats Itself Chiefs Capture Conference

Behind the leadership of eleven seniors, the 1985 football Chiefs produced their second consecutive Conference championship with an 8-1 record. An early season loss to Nekoosa was the difference between a good and great season for the Chiefs. Highlights of the year included: shutouts for the defense, a Homecoming win over Sparta, and landing six players on the All-Conference team. Junior quarterback Tim Decorah, junior running back Dave Shumway, and senior tight-end Brian Hartley represented the Dells on offense while seniors Pat Helland, linebacker, Dan Hess, defensive end, and Bill Rudeksdorf, were the defensive All-Conference selections for the Chiefs. Though the seniors will be missed, the Dells hopes to come back strong again next year with two of the six All-Conference players along with a good line up of juniors.

Head Coach Fred Kuhl had this to say in summary of a sensational season: "I think our success this year was due to the fact that the guys had a positive attitude about lifting weights and conditioning in the off-season; this showed in practice and in games with a great amount of leadership and a lot of love and togetherness."



Coach Piehl commented, "Next year's team will have the same big shoes to fill, but I feel that they have the potential to do it."




Key Club Activities

After getting to the airport and finally moving through the ticket lines, we were on our plane, and we suddenly realized that Washington D.C. was just a few short hours away.


