## ALMOST A NIGHT TO

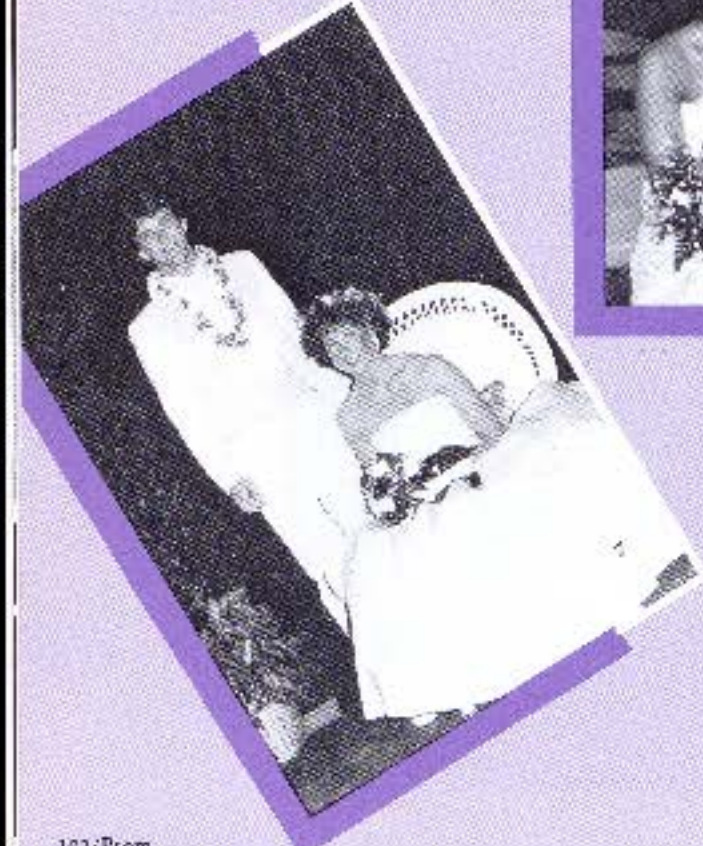

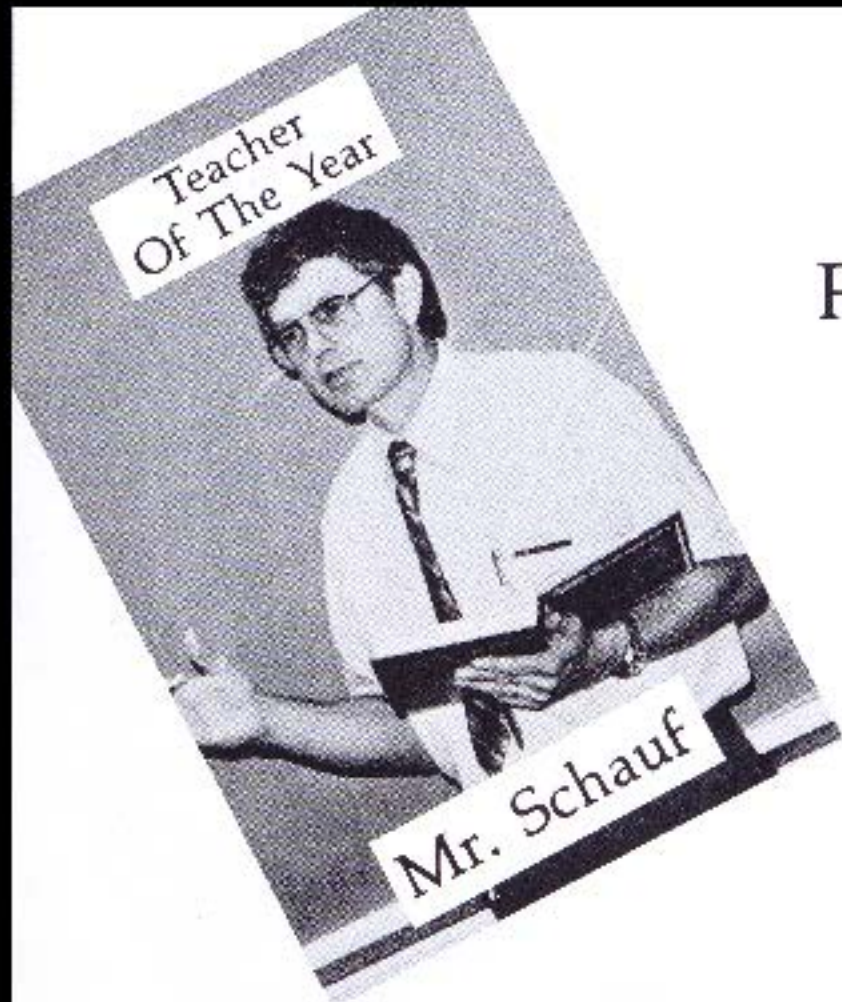

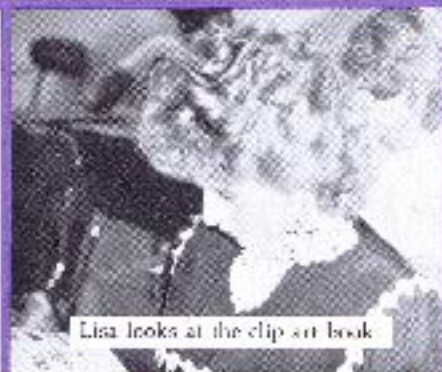
Throughout the course of the school year, many events occur. During these events, a select group of people make sure they are there to document these happenings for later reference: "The 1986 ARROW STAFF."
