Freshman Take A Step Back In Time

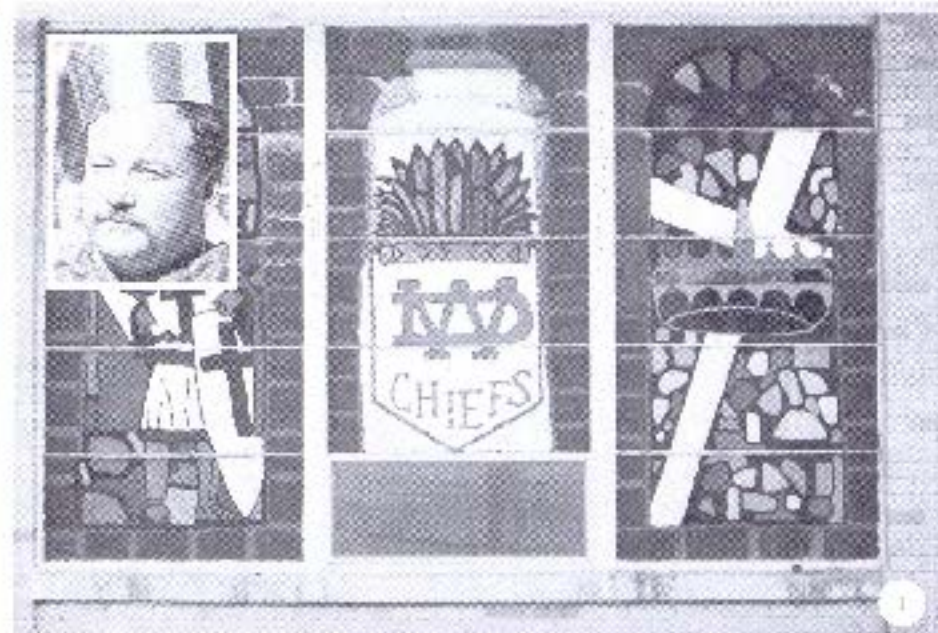

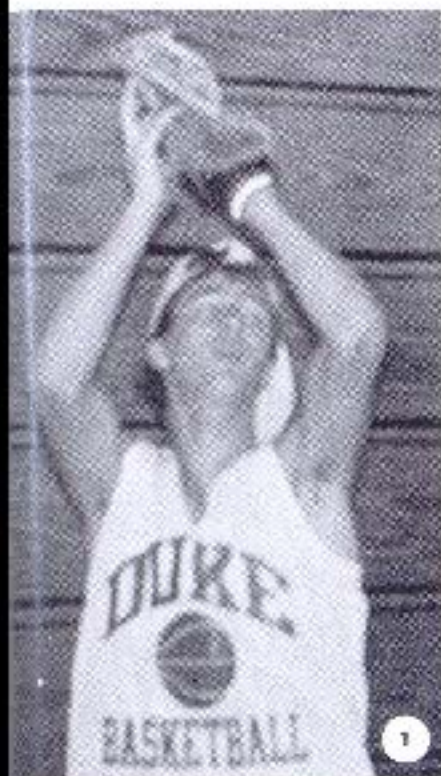

The rest of the team felt that everything they put into their practices paid off because their dedication allowed them to accomplish individual goals.



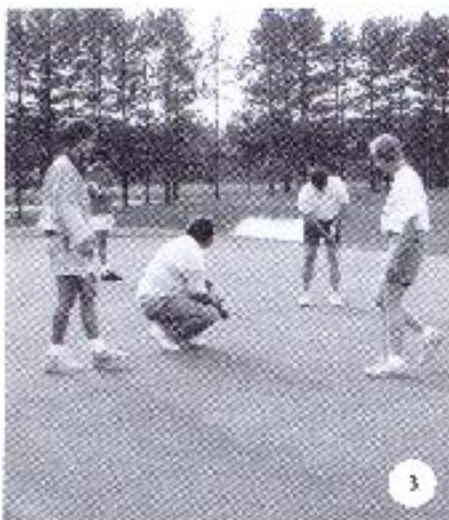

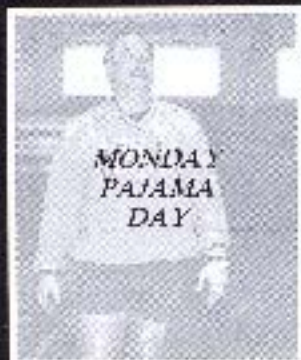
Get Into The Spirit!

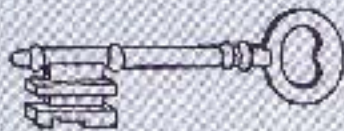
Though drinking under the age of 21 is illegal, SADD members feel that being safe is more important than being sorry, or worse, dead.
